What you need to know about...



Tennis Balls

Amherst is one of the few tennis clubs to provide tennis balls for all social and league match play.

Balls can be found on top of the light meter cupboard on the back wall. New cans of 4 balls are put out on rotation on an as necessary basis. We ask that members always return a full can of balls to the cupboard after play and retrieve any balls that may have been knocked over the fencing. If the balls are wet please leave them out of the cans and put on the rack to dry above the wall heater.

We cannot guarantee new balls on any day so if you wish to bring your own that may be a good idea if you want to ensure they are to your liking.

Floodlights

Courts 1 to 5 are floodlit.

The meters are in the black cupboard on the back wall.

Floodlights cost £1 for 15 minutes - £4 an hour = £1.00 each per hour if playing doubles

Courts 1, 2 and 4 are operated by key (held behind the bar for security). If using these courts we rely on an honesty system of payment. Please put £4 an hour cash in an envelope marked floodlights and pop in the safe under the kitchen counter.

Courts 3 and 5 are coin operated meters and accept £1 and £2 coins.

On club nights, cash/card payment is collected from each player upon arrival.

There is an automatic floodlight cut out at 10pm.

What you need to know about...



Security

In order to access the club grounds, fully paid members will be provided with the combination code for the padlock on the gate. The number will be changed once a year and advised upon renewal of membership. Courts 6 & 7 have their own combination padlock.

When unlocking the entry gate, please hang the padlock on the hook to the right of the clubhouse door.

If you are last to leave the grounds, please lock the gate with the padlock and spin the numbers to secure the lock.

If you require a key to the clubhouse, these can be obtained from the membership secretary at a cost of £5 each. Please bring cash.

If you are last to leave the club, please ensure all lights are off in the clubhouse, heaters are switched off and lock the clubhouse door. If there are people still playing on court, please ensure they have a club house key to lockup. If they do not, please lock the clubhouse and ask those remaining on court to lock the entry gate with the combination lock when they leave.

The Bar

We have a licenced bar which is run by club volunteers. We accept contactless or cash payment. Bar key holders are listed on the bar door.

We endeavour to open the bar on most club evenings and encourage our members to socialise after play. It is a great way to get to know other members, especially if you are a new member.

If you would like a drink and the bar is closed, always ask as there is usually a bar key holder around.

No under 18s are permitted behind the bar for any reason.

Dress Code

We do not have a strict dress code at the club and you will find it is a very relaxed environment to play tennis in.

We do however ask that only appropriate tennis shoes are worn on the courts. No day shoes, flip flops, bare foot. Shirts must be worn at all times.

Tea and Coffee

Members are welcome to make themselves a cup of tea or coffee from the supplies in the kitchen. Please put 50p per cup in the honesty piggy bank on the kitchen counter to enable us to replace supplies.

Weekly Play Schedule

Please refer to the play schedule on the noticeboard or website for court allocation.

At peak times there may be high demand for courts and this is where the play schedule gives players information on court priority.

It does not mean the courts are always fully booked out to the designated category of play, but should there be no courts available when you turn up to play, the schedule clearly lays out which courts are available and to whom.

If you are waiting to play, the ruling is any independent players must come off after they finish the set to allow for other members some court space. Please don't be afraid to ask if you wish to use a court. We want all our members to enjoy the facilities.

This ruling does not however apply to coaching sessions, club league or internal tournament matches or mix in sessions.

Please refer to the match schedule on the board for when home matches are scheduled. Each match takes up two courts. There are sometimes two home matches on at once which are generally on Sundays between 10am and 3pm.

What you need to know about...



Playing Visitors

We welcome visitors to play at the club.

They must be accompanied by a fully paid up member. The charge is £5 per visitor per visit. Please put their name in the visitor book on the kitchen counter and put £5 in an envelope in the little safe under the kitchen counter with your name, visitor's name and date on it. A visitor may attend three times only at £5 per visit.

Any potential new member is welcome to ONE free visit on a social club evening on a Wednesday, Thursday or Friday 6.30pm onwards if they wish to try the club and its facilities out.

Court Etiquette

Whilst we want to maintain a relaxed and fun atmosphere at the club, there are certain things we ask of all who use our courts so everyone can enjoy their tennis.

- Please wait for a break in play on courts 1, 2 and 4 before opening the gate to access/leave courts 1-3.
- Do not walk or run behind the baseline or across courts when game play is in progress.
- Always sweep the clay courts 6 and 7 after use.
- Return balls to the clubhouse and collect any balls you hit outside of the court netting.

Smoking

- No smoking or vaping within the club grounds or clubhouse.

Dogs

- Well behaved dogs are welcome on the balcony area but not on the courts or in the clubhouse.
