Our Tennis Environment

Court Maintenance (Richard Barwick)

In June, Replay Maintenance were contracted to add extra sand to all 3 courts. The reason being to ensure that the pile of the Astroturf remains vertical and to ensure that the courts remain in good order. On 27th September, they returned to do the twice-yearly maintenance job of cleaning the sand infill and brushing the courts. In addition, they spray and kill any moss found growing in the sand. This is a 4-hour job and, prior to the visit, we remove all the nets and court furniture. They have also provided a new net for court 3, a prize that we won in their customer competition. The courts are now 11 years old and, due to the regular maintenance Replay have provided, they are still playing well and should last for many more years.

Thank you Richard, for organising the maintenance work with Replay and to Geoff Bullock for his assistance in prepping the courts before and after the rejuvenation. The new net is now proudly in place on court 3, thanks to Richard entering us in the competition!



Mark Baxter has continued to brush the courts every fortnight in order to redistribute the sand, which makes them look in pristine condition. Thank you Mark.

Autumn leaves are now falling, so I urge everyone to remove any leaves/debris from the court surface before playing. You can do this quite quickly by using the dragnet, which is hanging on the fencing. It is vital to do this to prevent any debris being trodden into the Astroturf, so that we can prolong its life for as long as possible.

I would also like to thank Steve Temple and Mick Miller for regularly mowing the grass surrounding the courts. Newly mown grass certainly sets the courts off beautifully. Sadly, our lawnmower recently reached the end of its life, despite all Mick's efforts to remedy the problems, and a new one has now been purchased. Mick has also put up a new secure cupboard in the clubhouse. Thank you.

Gary Carpenter has kindly continued to produce a monthly Health and Safety Report, which is necessary for insurance purposes. It is a valuable piece of information that highlights any issues that we need to address - for example, we are currently looking at levelling the paving around court 3, to avoid any trip hazards and also tightening the fencing around the courts. Thank you Gary.

Safeguarding (Welfare Officer, Chris Howat)

It has been a relatively quiet few months, following on from all the work put in at the beginning of the year to ensure that our club meets all of the LTA's safeguarding standards. However, we must not lose sight of the fact that it remains **everyone's** responsibility to report any safeguarding concerns to me, as Welfare Officer, or to contact the emergency services if someone is in immediate danger.

The LTA has produced an extensive new list of support agencies you can contact in times of need. You can find this displayed in the clubhouse and on the website. There is also a new flowchart for reporting a concern, which shows some changes in

how the LTA Safeguarding Team follows through any matters that are escalated to them.

I would like to welcome Gary Carpenter to our Safeguarding Team which consists of Kath Temple, Suzanne Webb and myself. As our Health and Safety officer, he will make a valuable addition to the team.

Coaching News

Adult Coaching (Pauline Belt)

The adult coaching on Monday nights is ending due to the light after what has been another fabulous season of coaching with Rob Jones. The coaching focuses on doubles tactics and drills and improves tennis fitness. It takes place on a Monday evening from the beginning of April to the end of September with some time off for holidays. This season saw some 'beginners/rusty rackets' players move up into the intermediary class, it has been great to see their progression over a couple of years. These sessions are likely to recommence at the beginning of April 2024 when the clocks 'spring forward' at 5/6pm and depending on interest there may be one or two sessions for different levels.

Juniors Coaching(Chris Howat)

Junior coaching, led once again by Damian Galloway, took place during the summer term on Wednesday afternoons. The mini red group was very well attended, but the mini orange group was not full. The number of coaching sessions was reduced this term to allow for Damian's wedding and honeymoon. We wish him well in his new married life. Just before the start of the autumn term, he announced that he did not want to continue group coaching, preferring to focus more on individual coaching. This led to some hasty investigation to find a replacement coach and I am delighted to report that, thanks to her name being passed on to me by Kelly Hunter; we now are working with Jill Le Pla. She is a county standard player and an ex primary school teacher, who has recently gained her LTA Coach Accreditation Level 2, having done her training at York Tennis Club and St Peter's School. She is also keen to help develop our links with Appleton Primary School.

Friday afternoon junior club sessions have taken place through the summer term and will continue until October half term. There have been 2 groups - 1 primary school age group and Teen Tennis for the 11 - 16 yr olds. It is especially good to have the older juniors back playing and enjoying some fun games and competitive singles play.

I met with Matthew Snowden, the assistant head of the school, earlier in the summer. He is very keen to liaise with our club to enable the children to make use of our great village facility. Consequently, at the end of the children's 6 weeks of tennis at school, the teachers brought classes down to the courts to experience playing on

actual courts. Furthermore, as part of the PTA Experience Passport, Kelly Hunter organised a Wimbledon Experience Day. This was a tremendous success, as you will see from her report, and something we hope to repeat next summer.

Wimbledon Experience Day (Kelly Hunter)

This summer saw the first ever Wimbledon Experience Day held at Appleton Roebuck Tennis Club. Classes from Reception up to Year 6 at the primary schooled the excitement of walking down to the courts for the session and taking part in fun and engaging tennis activities.

Some members of the club kindly gave up their time to help run an open family session after school, which was attended by several keen families, who were eager to have some more time on the courts.
