#### Wimbledon 2021 Tickets update

The AELTC have said that, given the current guidance from the UK Government and Public Health Authorities, the most likely outcome is a reduced capacity tournament, and they are doing all they can to remain as flexible as possible in their ticket distribution for this year's Championships. The LTA have decided not to hold an LTA Advantage Wimbledon Ballot this year. However, they will continue to work closely with the AELTC to ensure an allocation of tickets will be available to eligible LTA Advantage members. All sessions are open to all members and recommendations are given as guidelines to help with choosing your most appropriate session. All Club Social Sessions are free to members and can be booked under the social sessions tab at the top of the court bookings page. Members who book onto a session will be contacted on the day and arranged onto courts for their first game. Don't be shy! All the members who regularly attend the social sessions will be very welcoming to anyone coming along to join in for the first time.

## New Entrance Gate

We have worked hard to achieve grant funding for a new gate entry system for the club. The gate is due to be installed in mid April and will mean we no longer have to fumble about with our padlock! We are hoping it will prove to have lots of advantages with regards to security and safeguarding, and it should help the running of the club by providing us with lots of useful data. For our members we are hoping not too much will change.

- When you book a court you will be given your gate code to enter the club for that court booking (all members playing on that court should use that same code to enter)
- When you book onto a Club Social Session you will be given the gate code for that social session
- When you book onto a coaching course you will be given the gate code for your coaching session time
- When league matches are scheduled, team members and visiting club players will use the match bookings gate code provided
- Any member just visiting the clubhouse (for example, not booking a court to play tennis) will use the Clubhouse gate code
