COACHING SERVICES AGREEMENT – CARL DOUGLAS TENNIS COACHING

Between Carl Douglas Tennis Coaching, identified within this agreement as CDTC and Bramford Tennis Club, identified within this agreement as “the Club”.

1. This agreement will commence on 1st June 2024 and will be based on a “rolling” three year cycle, reviewed annually in line with the club’s membership cycle but extending (subject to no breaches) to the end date of the agreement (currently 31st May 2027).
2. CDTC will be the sole provider of coaching services to “the Club” for the period from 1st June 2024 to 31st May 2027. CDTC will also be free to provide coaching services to other clubs and organisations during this period.
3. CDTC will report the progress of the coaching programme to “the Club” committee by attending club committee meetings and through the submission of an annual report to coincide with the club’s AGM.
4. CDTC will work on a sole trader self-employed basis, such that the coaching programme is entirely self-funded and at no financial risk to “the Club”. Nothing in this agreement shall render any person providing services under this agreement as an employee, worker, agent or partner of Bramford Tennis Club and you shall not hold yourself out as such.
5. CDTC will be subject to an annual fee based “special membership” arrangement¹ with “the Club” during the period of the agreement, allowing them to book courts in advance for coaching purposes **only** (group and individual). Block booking of courts for new coaching sessions will be agreed in advance with “the Club” prior to securing courts via the online booking system.
6. CDTC may also offer at their discretion a limited amount of non-chargeable “give-back” hours to the club to support events such as Club Open days²
7. CDTC will determine their own rates for coaching (groups and 1:1’s) and **all income from the coaching programme** will be paid directly to CDTC via course sign up options and payment methods defined by CDTC. Participants will “contract” directly with CDTC and be subject to CDTC terms and conditions and data privacy policy. Coaching for members of “the Club” will be charged at a discounted rate to benefit members and to encourage club membership and revenue.
8. **All income from Club membership** even where such income has come as a direct result of participation and engagement in a CDTC coaching programme or activity, will be paid directly to “the Club” via the membership options and payment methods listed on the club’s website.
9. CDTC may at their sole discretion provide a substitute coach and where this is the case, will ensure that any substitute has appropriate LTA qualifications, enhanced DBS, Emergency First Aid at Work (EAFW), safeguarding certifications and insurance cover.

10. CDTC's Head coach will oversee all coaching programmes and will be LTA qualified at a minimum Level 3 (Accredited +), with enhanced DBS, Emergency First Aid at Work (EAFW), current LTA safeguarding certificates. CDTC will also be responsible for maintaining adequate public liability and professional indemnity insurance (via LTA coach accreditation) for all coach led activities that take place at "the Club" for the duration of this agreement.
11. All certifications mentioned above must be maintained in line with the LTA's recertification process and timescales and copies of coaching and DBS certificates will be provided to "the Club" upon request.
12. No other person may coach at "the Club" during the period of this agreement, except with the prior consent of CDTC Head Coach.
13. Once contracted, CDTC will define and agree a coaching programme that provides opportunities³ for participation by members of the club and the wider community throughout the tennis season.
14. CDTC **will not** be responsible for any targets relating to converting non-members to members but will work with "the Club" though preferential member rates and provide up to two hours of free support at agreed formal club open days to encourage membership.
15. CDTC may at its discretion also work with other parties in the community e.g. local schools to raise awareness of CDTC and "the Club" and the coaching and membership options available.
16. The coaching team will have priority court booking for junior group and 1:1 lessons at "the Club" between 4.00pm to 6.30pm during agreed weekdays in school term times and on Saturday mornings between 8am to 12.30pm. Adult group and 1:1 coaching may also be offered during daytime and evening slots at mutually agreed times between "the Club" and CDTC.
17. CDTC will provide tennis suitable equipment for coaching sessions e.g. balls, mini-tennis nets and rackets but "the Club" may at its discretion fund additional kit for its own use to support club events such as open days.
18. CDTC will work with "the Club" on the annual risk assessment as part of "the Club's" LTA registered venue review. CDTC will also conduct risk assessments on a per occasion basis to ensure that the courts are fit for coaching and retains the right to cancel or modify coaching sessions where a risk to health and safety is identified.
19. CDTC will advise "the Club" committee of any identified risk assessment issues that need to be resolved. In exceptional cases, CDTC may advise that they are suspending the coaching programme until issue(s) identified in the risk assessment are fully addressed by "the Club".
20. CDTC shall have access to the clubhouse/storage shed in support of the coaching programme. The "Club" will also use their best endeavours to arrange free access for CDTC to the toilet block in the adjacent sports pavilion. It is noted that the pavilion is a "shared" facility between bowls club, football club and tennis club and at times functions as a public bar.
21. CDTC coaches shall ensure they present themselves in a professional manner and that any substitute coaches they provide maintain the same high standards.

22. CDTC Head Coach will have the right to advertise his/her services at "the Club" via the clubs "coaching" pages and other means available e.g. newsletters, posters, social media etc.
23. All marketing material and coaching programmes shall state that: "Payment is made to CDTC directly. Reimbursement or sessions cancelled due to severe weather, sickness or other reason is at the discretion of CDTC".
24. A term's notice in writing is required by either side for termination of this agreement.
25. Despite clause 25, this agreement may be terminated immediately by "the Club" in the case of proven breach of conditions, or gross misconduct.
26. Each party shall indemnify the other party from any loss, liability, costs (including reasonable legal costs), damages or expenses arising from any breach by the indemnifying party, or any substitute engaged under this agreement, of the terms of this agreement, including any negligent or reckless act, omission or default in the provision of the coaching service. This provision and all other warranties contained within this agreement are subject to limited liability as defined by clause 28.
27. Limited liability - Except as expressly provided in this Agreement, each party (CDTC and the "Club") makes no guarantees, representations or warranties of any kind or nature, express or implied with respect to the coaching services negotiated, agreed upon and rendered. In no event shall either party be liable to the other party for any indirect, consequential, or special damages. Notwithstanding any damages that the other party may incur, each party's entire liability under this agreement, and the other party's exclusive remedy, shall be **limited** to the amount earned by the liable party as a result of this specific coaching services agreement over the previous 12 months up to and including the termination date.
28. This Service Agreement (SA) may be extended beyond the end date established in clause 1 by mutual, written agreement of the Parties. Upon any such extension, this SA shall continue to be in effect, and all provisions of the SA shall retain the same force and effect as before the extension.
