General property management	Members, staff and visitors could be harmed while on site. For example, by falling roof tiles or in a fire caused by a faulty gas main	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The fabric of the building is regularly inspected for damage or wear and tear • Full records are kept of all remedial actions and repairs • Emergency exits are clearly identified with emergency lighted signs • The premises are secured at night to prevent arson • A comprehensive fire detection and alarm system is installed and tested regularly 				
Indoor courts	All players, officials and visitors to the courts could be injured if they trip or fall	I have considered this and it doesn't apply to my Venue.				

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Outdoor Courts	Players, officials and members of the public could be injured if they trip or fall	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Courts are cleared of debris on a daily basis • Courts are routinely inspected for algae and vegetation and this is removed if found • Regular inspections are carried out to look for wear and tear and a documented maintenance programme is in place • Courts are appropriately lit • Wire fencing is checked for snag hazards • Stray balls and other equipment is cleared from the courts daily 				
Club grounds and gardens	Club members, staff, volunteers and members of the public could be injured if they fell on damaged path	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Documented maintenance programme is in place to manage wear and tear to steps, paths and car parks • Walkways and paths are well lit 				

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Bars and restaurants	Members, staff and visitors could be injured, for example, if they slip on a spillage or cut themselves on broken glass	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Spillages are dealt with quickly and wet floors are mopped immediately • Glasses and bottles are stored safely • Furniture is inspected regularly any necessary repairs are carried out promptly 				
Kitchens	Staff may be scalded, burned or cut in the kitchen and visitors in the restaurant could be at risk if food was incorrectly prepared	I have considered this and it doesn't apply to my Venue.				
Changing rooms	Members, staff and visitors might be injured in changing rooms as a result of a slip or from using contaminated shower facilities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Regular, documented cleaning programme is in place to ensure that floors are kept clean and dry 				
Swimming pools and spas	Members, staff and visitors could be injured from drowning, slipping or bathing in contaminated water	I have considered this and it doesn't apply to my Venue.				

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Staff and security	Members, staff and visitors could be harmed by intruders or have property stolen or damaged	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Club has a policy in place to protect lone workers and staff have been trained and made aware of the risks • Rules of acceptable behaviour are displayed along with the relevant enforcement measures • Money is counted and stored in secure areas • Stocks of equipment are securely held when not supervised 				
Fitness gym	Members could be injured as a result of using the gym equipment	I have considered this and it doesn't apply to my Venue.				
Weed Spraying	members, general public could come in contact with the chemicals	Only spray and treat the grounds when very few, ideally none at all members present and on the grounds, warn members if and when areas have been treated. put signs up to warn
