

Camberley Closed Club Tournament – Rules & Guidance

General Tournament Guidelines

- All matches need to be completed on or before the quoted “Play By Date” as shown on the relevant draw sheet. Please ensure you make every effort to play your match asap and get in touch with your opponent.
- If you are the player or team that is on top of the draw you are responsible for getting in touch with your opponent to play.
- Every player in the tournament will have been provided with contact details for respective players and teams in the competition they have entered. These will be sent via email. You may receive up-to 3 separate emails if you have entered all eligible events.
- For matches that have not been played by the “Play By Date” show on the respective draw sheet the Men’s & Ladies Captain will have the final decision as to who goes through or not. We have a tight schedule so be respectful to all entrants.

Recording Your Results

- On completion of your match the winner must update the respective draw sheet in the clubhouse with their name and result.
- For Ladies in the “Round Robin” event please record your overall set scores as this will be used to determine final group placings.

Men’s Singles, Men’s Doubles Events

- These are standard knockout events.
- If you lose your first match you will be entered into the plate event. The draw sheet, play by dates will be advised asap.
- All matches are best of 3 sets with a 7-point tie-breaker in each set. If you want to play a 10 point Championship Tie Breaker as a 3rd set you must agree this with your opponent before the match begins.

Ladies Round Robin Groups

- All matches are best of 3 sets with a 7-point tie-breaker in the first two sets. The 3rd set is a 10-point Championship Tie Breaker.
- Apart from the general guidelines provided above, you will be awarded a point for each set you win in each of your matches. Final positions will be determined by the number of sets won.
- If there is a tie, the group head to head result will determine final placings in the group and for the semi-finals

Mixed Doubles

- This is a standard knockout event.
- All matches are best of 3 sets with a 7-point tie-breaker in each set. If you want to play a 10-point Championship Tie Breaker as a 3rd set you must agree this with your opponent before the match begins.

Finals Day – 29th June

- All finals are best of 3 sets with a 7-point tie-breaker in each set.
- For the Men's Singles and Men's Doubles plate finals the 3rd set will be a 10-point Championship Breaker.
