4. Chairman's report (Verbal)

Normally the chair's report is circulated pre-meeting. This year, however, DV wants to address everyone directly as there are important matters to be covered.

All the leads have submitted written reports which were circulated with the AGM papers. DV picks out some personal highlights.

- Competition The Devon & Cornwall Whirlwind Tour mini players aged U8 to U10 and the NEXUS Tour for U12 and U16 but capped (rating) to give the lower rated children an opportunity to compete. Both these tours are extremely well supported and the envy of other Counties in the South West.
- Performance The structure, organisation and content of the County Training is also the envy of other Counties and with the introduction of tier 2 training, more children are benefiting from County Training.

The Boys Under 14 team got to the National Final (at Nottingham) which was all level by the end, but they lost it on a single Championship Tie break shootout. We are all so proud of the boys' achievement.

Also congratulations must go to our Ladies 70s captained by Anne Louis who won Division 2 without dropping a single set.

- **Coaches Network** (Just starting up) The first group meeting has been held and was a great success with 18 coaches attending.
- **Disability & Inclusion** Participation has increased greatly and Devon is now at the top of the table in the South West.
- Media & Communication This area has also improved greatly over the last month with far
 more social media posts and engagement. Devon also staged three forums across the
 County for clubs and venues to help with their use of Media, Publicity and Communication
- Safeguarding Again, Devon leads the way in the South West in this area as the most engaged and organised County. This is shown by the fact that some of our policies and procedures are being used by the National LTA and rolled out to all the other Counties as the exemplary way forward.
- Accounts Sponsorship Andy has again done a great job of balancing the books and running a tight ship, and he will be giving a full report verbally later. However, we have finished the year with a deficit of £24K.

This is largely down to a bad debt of £20k incurred from sponsorship - this is the issue that DV wanted to explain verbally.

EXPLANATION OF SITUATION:

 Devon, along with 14 other Counties, has used a third party to obtain sponsorship since 2017. Some of the counties have been using the same third party for many other years. This person is a county chairman and LTA councillor.

- This year something went on which resulted in the misuse of Wimbledon Tickets from all 14 Counties.
- This resulted in many tickets being cancelled hence our sponsor withheld £20k from the County. The same has happened to the other Counties to a lesser or greater extent.
- The Counties themselves did nothing wrong and were not aware of what the third party actually did in breach of the regulations.
- The LTA has carried out an investigation and as a result has decided to penalise the 14 Counties involved by fining them between 10% and 25% of their discretionary allowance of Wimbledon tickets for the 2020 Championship.
- Devon has been fined 25% which means we will have fewer tickets available to raise sponsorship or for our patrons.
- We have appealed and asked for this sanction to be reduced to 10% in line with other counties.

DV adds that this is an area of sadness in what has otherwise been an excellent year.

Volunteers – On behalf of Devon Tennis DV thanks all the volunteers across the County who give up their time running all aspects of tennis.

DV adds that if anyone would like to volunteer for the County then please talk to him or any of the Management Committee here tonight

Questions from the room:

- Does the penalty affect the clubs' ticket allocations? No, just the county's allocation.
- What would the usual year-end result be? Usually a small deficit of £2,000-4,000.
- How did it go wrong? The person who was using our tickets was an upstanding, respected member of the LTA. He used an agency to find sponsors. This agency flouted the rules by advertising tickets for sale to the general public. This is a total breach of the T&Cs. All 14 counties have been caught up in this. The sponsor withheld money from us because the LTA cancelled the tickets which had been issued to the sponsor for those tickets.
- What happens this year? We will try to source our own sponsors in county and DV will work very closely with other counties to find sponsors. We'll have fewer tickets and lower income.
- Why have we been penalised more than the other counties? There was a pot of tickets to find sponsors. Some of these were used for sale. Just bad luck that a lot of Devon's tickets were used. It was just pure chance. We all committed the same breach.
- Do we have any comeback from the person involved? No. We could sue the sponsor but that would be expensive.

DV stresses that this should not get out to the press as it is embarrassing to the county, LTA, etc. DV asks for people to be discrete about the subject.

DV offers to step aside if people feel this was his responsibility. He introduced the person concerned to Devon Tennis initially. This is the first time that anything has gone wrong. In the past few years, this same person has raised hundreds of thousands of pounds for grassroots tennis. It's important to remember the positives.

- Will he face sanctions? Almost certainly.
- Seems unfair that Devon has been unduly punished.
- What happens to the paid staff? We can go on for a few years with the reserve but that will dry up in the end. We need to carry on with the sponsorship route. Devon Tennis is

on the way up and it is a huge shame to halt this progress. We must do all we can to keep the ball rolling.

6. Treasurer's Report & Accounts (Verbal and corresponding report)

Andy Malcolm (AM) reports a loss of about 19k mainly due to the Wimbledon tickets issue. Without that, we would have had a good year. Membership fees stayed the same. We had a grant from LTA for Performance Programme landscape. Competition income went up slightly. Commercial income is combination of sponsorship and patrons' fees. Staff costs have gone up slightly too; this was the first year of 3 paid staff. Otherwise, much as expected – other than sponsorship.

Balance at end of year is £121,000. Lost about 15% of reserves due to sponsorship issue. This year's loss will lead to approx. £8,000 loss on tickets next year.

We will absolutely not lose our paid staff. Even if they are paid from the reserves. AM will also send a written report with the minutes.

AM introduces 4 matters for the AGM to vote on:

- 1) The AGM accepts the annual accounts.
- 2) The council proposes that we increase the Patrons fee to £100 for the year starting January 2020. (The patrons' scheme is currently closed to new members but will be reopened if numbers drop below 100 members which will be the maximum number allowed. We will operate a waiting list on a first come first served basis.). In future, the patrons fee will be decided by the management committee at the end of the year and the amount be ratified by the AGM.
- 3) The fee for leagues to affiliate with the County remains at £25.
- 4) Reappoint Francis Clark as our auditors.

Proposed by Andy Malcolm Seconded by Ashley Scott Unanimously carried.

Questions:

Reserves – currently 120k but will go down to 110k – what is best practice in terms of what you hold? Sport England suggests a maximum holding of 12 months of expenditure as reserves. We don't get an LTA grant due to the level of our reserves. This was about 27k for this year for us. We have around 48 months' worth in reserves to create a good 'safety net'. This means we can give loans etc to clubs and there are other areas that are being funded by Devon Tennis. By end of next year, we will have spent 15-18% of our reserves. We usually make a slight loss each year.

DV adds that the more sponsorship we get in, the more we spend on tennis so we aren't really able to build up our reserves.

- Why are we keeping patrons limited to 100? We don't want more patrons as we need the tickets for sponsorship as this is the main source of income.
