World Tennis Number

The ITF World Tennis Number is a new rating system for all tennis players across the world which will make it easier for everyone who plays tennis in Britain to organise and play against opponents of a similar standard. Please do take time to read the World Tennis Number (WTN) venue support guide. If ALL venue results are submitted to the LTA, this will ensure that a player's WTN is accurate.

In Spring, the LTA is launching a new self-submission of results tool for the WTN which will allow players to submit results which are not part of a formal competition, encouraging local play and competition.

Play Your Way To Wimbledon

This is a new and exciting competition providing juniors with the opportunity to progress through to compete on the world famous grass courts at Wimbledon, via a singles or doubles pathway. Players start by competing locally at an event taking place at a local club, park or school with the winners progressing through to the County and/or Regional Finals, and then onto the National Finals at Wimbledon. There are 2 eligible age groups:-

- Singles for boys and girls aged 11-14
- Doubles for boys and girls aged 11-18

The closing date is: 17 April 2022

Safeguarding

From 1 October 2018, all LTA Registered Venues were required to meet five standards as part of their LTA Venue Registration. Loan Scheme

Cumbria Tennis has set aside a funding pot in order to assist clubs with key projects. This funding will be using a substantial amount of our reserves and the intention is to add to it should we have an annual surplus. The overall idea is to make loans available to help clubs develop their facilities or other key areas that will help improve participation and programmes.

In Brief

- Up to £10,000
- Interest Free
- Repayable over 10 years maximum
- Subject to application

Conditions

Cumbria Tennis funding is simple. There are conditions and criteria which are listed below. All loans will be interest free, with no security required and loan repayment periods will be flexible. The following

information details the main criteria and application process that is involved in order to gain funding from Cumbria Tennis.

- The club should be a registered place to play and Tennis Mark accredited would be beneficial.
- Cumbria LTA should be considered the lender of last resort with, for example, the LTA, Sport England and Local Authorities already have been approached.
- An acceptable coaching programme should be in place and agreement to work with Cumbria Tennis on a Junior Development programme, Safeguarding Policy, open access policy, licensed and qualified coaches and additional key areas of tennis development
- Applications will be considered twice per annum dates TBC.
- Provide accounts and cash flow forecasts.
- Minimum of 10 years security of tenure with a copy of the lease (if applicable) with the application.
- If the project requires planning permission, then this will need to be in place before funds are agreed.All loans will be unsecured.
- The Club will need to contribute annually to a sinking fund for the future resurfacing, maintenance or repairs to their courts see LTA sinking fund guidance notes for further details.
- The Club will need to have a constitution, which expressly gives them the power to borrow money.

Type of Project

- No set criteria for the type of project that we will loan fund, however we would expect the majority of
 projects to be a facility project
- Priority will be given to new build, lights, refurbishment.
- The project will need to demonstrate how it meets certain Key Performance Indicators
- The project will need to be viable in the long term

Coaches Bursary

In Brief

- This scheme is funded through Active Cumbria
- Maximum 50% contribution towards course fees
- CLTA will request voluntary hours in return via coaching or helping at CLTA event.
- Subject to application

The scheme is to enable level 1, 2, 3 & 4 coaches to enhance their knowledge and attain further qualifications. All identified coaches will be required to do "payback" hours – approximately 10 hours for level 1 and 20 for level 2.

Training will be via approved LTA courses. Level 1 and level 2 courses take place annually in Cumbria, and if there is demand the current number of courses can be increased.
