#### Club news

### Our new all weather courts are now open!

Work commenced on the upgrade of two of the old astro tennis courts at the end of July 2020 and now they are open and ready for play. We hope you have all been able to enjoy a game or two. We would like to thank Fosse for completing the court rejuvenation and also thanks to members who have waited patiently for this moment. The completion of the new tennis courts is the culmination of a lot of careful planning and hard work from Committee members and volunteers, which we would like to acknowledge.

An official unveiling and celebration of these new courts will be held in the near future, subject to Government

guidelines.





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## **EA&LTS** development plan

Our immediate priority was to ensure that we could all keep playing all year round which has been achieved by the two new astro courts. Whilst it feels like a big step forward to have achieved this, we are acutely aware we need more courts that are playable all year around and are working on a plan for this, along with a couple of other aspects to move the club forward.

We recently offered all members the chance to hear more about the Committee's plans for the future of the club. The members on that call suggested we put a summary in the newsletter for all members to hear, so here we go!

We have defined three objectives for the long-term future of the club:

1. Develop the club's facilities and encourage more all year round play There are interim measures we're looking at, like the roller mop so puddles can be mopped up more effectively (this has been bought and is on court 9), interim floodlight measures (tricky for all sorts of reasons but being explored!) and covers for the clay courts to protect against frost but, really, the best solution is to resurface the shale / clay to all weather courts and install additional floodlights. The costs are huge and realistically we are estimating it will take c. 5 years to be able to afford to resurface the next pair of courts if we fund everything ourselves, and the floodlights even longer.

Our preference is obviously to secure some grant funding from the LTA. Many of you will know that our biggest barrier to this is that we do not have a long-term lease for the land we are on, and one has never been forthcoming. We are talking to Warwickshire LTA and, hopefully, Midlands LTA to try and get their support before we approach Calthorpe Estates (the landowners) again. So, in summary, we have a plan but lots of things will have to go our way for us to secure a lease - but we have to at least try!

## 2. Be a force for good in our local community

During lockdown we opened the club up for a few sessions and allowed members of the public to come and use the courts. We felt that it was a win-win; some people who had been unable to play on park courts as they were still shut came and played and we gained a few new members as a result. We are therefore going to give these sessions a go on an ongoing basis and see if it encourages some people who would not normally play in a club

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environment to do that.

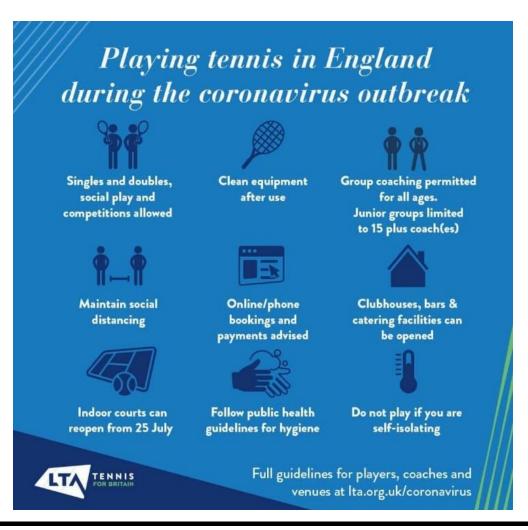
We are also considering being an outlet for 'social prescribing'; this is something that some GP surgeries do when they feel exercise is a more appropriate treatment for people than medication.

We think that supporting the local community is a) just a good thing to do but b) may help us in conversations with the LTA and Calthorpe Estates.

#### 3. Run the club as well as possible for minimal effort

As you know, the club is entirely run by volunteers. We all have limited time and energy and so need to make sure we are as effective as possible. The Committee is currently discussing the Committee and Subcommittee structure and tweaking the roles on the Main Committee - this should be in time for the AGM so there will be plenty of opportunities for new volunteers!
