Policies

Everyone in the club, including all members, is required to read and comply with these policies. They are as follows:

Safeguarding Policy: this explains the club's commitment to safeguarding and what to do if you have a concern about the well-being or safety of a child or an adult at risk. Unless the danger is immediate, you should contact Jane or Dave, the Welfare Officers, or the LTA safeguarding team about the concern. Your concern will be treated seriously and confidentially.

Code of Conduct: this explains the standard of behaviour expected from everyone involved with the club, including the expectations that all children and adults are treated in a supportive and friendly way and with respect. There is a children's version of the code that all under 18s are provided with. Parents are required to make sure that their children understand the code of conduct too.

Diversity and Inclusion Policy: we want everyone to have the opportunity to participate in tennis, and the policy explains how we will do this e.g. by supporting inclusive practice and taking action where there are concerns about discrimination.

Use of Changing Rooms Policy: this states that parents are responsible for supervising their child under 12 using the changing rooms, adult coaches will not use the shower while children are changing and mobile phones must not be used in the changing room.

Anti-Bullying Policy: this spells out everyone's roles and responsibilities to help prevent bullying at the club, and how we will make sure it is stopped if it does happen and provide support to those affected.

Online Safety and Communication Policy: this sets out how we expect everyone in the club to use the internet and social media in ways to protect children and adults from potential harm. It includes precautions to be taken by coaches when communicating by mobile phone e.g. for parents to be copied into any messages to children

Photography and Filming Best Practice Guidance: the club endorses this guidance from the LTA, which includes the requirement to gain written consent from a child and their parent before taking and using a child's image.

Safe Recruitment Policy: when the club is involved in recruiting staff, this policy spells out how this will be done to help safeguard children and adults at risk.

Disciplinary Policy: this spells out how we will respond to concerns that a member may have breached club policies.

House & Grounds update


The courts are in great shape thanks to the hard work of the HGV team, who work tirelessly to maintain all playing and non-playing areas of the site. Thanks especially to David Wride for his recent efforts in painting the courtside of the clubhouse. There are one or two items that we are asking members to attend to as part of their playing routine:

- Some moss has been noted on the peripheral areas of the clay courts please could all members undertake some extra brushing when possible. Please could all members pay attention to the centre strip between the courts, behind the baselines, and to the outer sides of the tramlines towards the fences, to help prevent the moss from accumulating.
- During very high temperatures, the hard court surface can soften, which means that usage can damage the tarmac. Please check before play.
- Some of the nets have been over-tightened recently, which has damaged the tape please always check that the centre tapes are free before adjusting the height of the nets

The HGV team meets on the first Saturday of every month, so the next session will take place on **Saturday 5**th **August, 10am-12noon.** New volunteers are always welcome – no skills or experience required, just a willingness to muck in and help keep the club running. Previous tasks have included weeding, hedge trimming, drain cleaning, decorating etc. Tea/biscuits will be provided!

Clay court maintenance

To keep our clay courts in the best condition possible, we ask members to please sweep the courts after each use. Brushes are available courtside. Ideally the courts should be swept in a spiral manner, rather than from side to side. This technique starts from the outside edges of the court (i.e. into the



fence) working your way into the centre. This ensures that the clay is spread back on to the court rather than out to the side. Please do NOT brush the court if the clay is wet.

Club security

A reminder to members to please remain vigilant and make sure to take the following actions to improve security at the club:

- Please do not leave the front door to the clubhouse open. This is a basic precaution that prevents unauthorised access to the building.
- Please don't leave any belongings unattended.
- Coaches have now been asked to replace the bar across the back door leading to the terrace when they leave on weekends, even if members are still playing. If you need to access the clubhouse after this, please enter by the front door. If you do feel the need to re-open the back door, please close it again when you leave and replace the bar.
- If you are entering the club via the side gate or the front door (i.e. where there is coded access), please do not allow people who are unknown to you to tailgate you into the club.
