We held a committee Meeting on the evening of Tuesday 3rd of May 2022. The committee and trustees would like me to find out why you can't explore any other sites and why Elmwood is the only possible location for this planned mast. An explanation would be helpful.

Without Prejudice

Dear Jackie,

On a without prejudice basis, I have included the directed search area below. This search area is an internal document so please do not distribute this.

The search area shows the approximate region that the network planner has calculated where a site would be able to fulfil the network deficit. The point in the centre of the circle is the optimal location from a technical standpoint, so the aim from a technical standpoint is to be located as close to this as possible. The green circles/slices represent existing active sites in the O2 network – the new site needs to be located to fit in with the existing network "jigsaw", and not encroach too closely to the existing sites.

Due to the dominant land use being densely-packed residential within this area of search, there are very few viable options when considering other feasibility aspects, such as visual impact, build feasibility etc. The footpaths in the area are considered to be too narrow to host a base station, as sufficient space is needed to allow for free pedestrian movement around the base station.

Elmwood Lawn Tennis Club represents one of the few areas where a practically feasible base station could be considered, which is why this has been nominated as the most suitable location. The closest potential alternative would be the fringes of King Edward VII Park along Doyle Gardens, but in order to find a feasible location, this would need to be located near the junction of Furness Road, which has been deemed an inferior location for the network, due to its location away from the key coverage areas, including the railway to the south.

I trust this provides some clarity on the site selection process?

Thank-you for this information it is really helpful.

Could you find out if your client knows about the new mast which has literally just gone up by Roundwood Park near the main entrance at the end of Doyle Gardens and if they have explored network sharing arrangements with them?

Response from Waldon on 24 May 2022

Thank you for bringing this new mast to my attention.

O2 require their own pole in order to provide the full range of technologies needed in this area, so will not be able to share the new pole at Doyle Gardens. For information, O2 and Vodafone often share sites, however these need to be of a larger scale and take up more footprint space to be able to support the additional equipment. During my initial approach, Vodafone and O2 both had a network requirement for a site in the area, however as Vodafone have since withdrawn their requirement, we are able to propose a slimmer pole which takes up less space, which is what the drawings provided to you show.

The resurvey is required to try to relocate the slimmer pole to the periphery of the

tennis club, in order to minimise it's impact on the ongoing operation of the site, and to locate it in a more secluded location to reduce its visual impact. In particular I believe space at the boundary with All Souls Avenue might be deemed more suitable, due to improved screening from the trees.

We can look to investigate the footpaths around the tennis club at the same time as the resurvey – if they are wide enough to accommodate a site whilst still allowing free passage of pedestrians (and if the ground is service-free and suitable), we can look to pursue this further instead.

Can you please review and confirm if this approach is agreeable

It has come to my attention that another mast has been erected in fairly close proximity to the previous mast I pointed out to you, also around Doyle Gardens. We are still unsure as to why Elmwood Lawn Tennis Club is still a main candidate for a mast when it appears that other providers have been able to situate their masts on the public pavements around Doyle Gardens.

Has Waldon, since the withdrawal of Vodafone's network requirements in the area, redone their technical review to see if a smaller mast around the NW10 area would provide sufficient coverage for the network deficit? If not, we would strongly encourage this – rather than resurveying our club to install a smaller mast.

Court Bookings

Membership

All the full membership places have been taken and membership is now closed until 2023.

We have virtually the same number of adult players (family, couple, adult, concession & country) (365) as last year (364) with the addition of 12 near-neighbours.

Off-Peak membership has been offered to the top 100 on the waiting list in batches. Limited take up so far.

Membership stands at 697 members (377 playing adults & 460 including Off-Peak) and £82,097 membership fees.

Total for 2021/22 689 members (364 playing adults & 551 including Off-Peak) and £68,688. 2020/21 414 members (300 playing adults) and £57,204.

2019/20 313 members (231 playing adults) and £38,550.

The Waiting List stands at 243 entries (representing 330 adults). The Waiting List increased by 10 entries (14 Adults) since 2-May-22.

It was recognised by all present that the admin and club responsibility of running a club on behalf of this, larger than we have ever had, group of members has been taking a lot more time. As a volunteer committee we should concentrate on listening to the members new and old to grow participation and encourage more support from within the membership for future projects too.
