PLAYING

In addition to the Bournemouth 'Tennis in the Park' (www.tennisbournemouth.co.uk/tennis-in-the-park/) system mentioned in the May Newsletter, there are now some more options available. Please note that you may need to register on the ClubSpark system for this option.

There are 2 courts at West Moors which are free to use but are on a 'first come – first served' basis. One of the courts is not quite up to standard but can be used for 'warming up' whilst waiting for the other one to be free. You can use our Clubspark booking system for this venue but it will not guarantee that the court will be free when you turn up.

Canford School has courts but charge £7-50 per hour & these have to be booked beforehand..

In Poole you can pay £24 per year to play at Leicester Road, Branksome, or for £40 per year this would also include the courts in Poole Park.
