GLTA Membership Report - 2019-20

This year we have had

- 79 Adult single memberships
- 8 Adults on couple memberships
- 2 adult daytime memberships
- 14 adults on family memberships
- 4 adults on shared family memberships

This is a total of 107 paid up adult members

- 7 young adult memberships
- 13 under 10 memberships + 14 children on family memberships
- 10 10-18 memberships + 8 on supplementary memberships

A total of 54 paid up junior members

Last year, peaks for membership were clearly at the time of membership renewal, however, it was clear that lots of members had to be reminded to pay up the membership - this is something that needs to be addressed as it is clear from

speaking to members that not all understood the system and did not appear to receive the invitations.

In addition, other people joined as a result of the successful open day, some also joined having gone to the express course. However, uptake from this is still not great.

Over the year 14 people took out a trial membership, of these 7 went on to take up full membership - this may be something that we need to look at in terms of finding out why they did not go on to take this up - is it due to:

- Number of sessions available to them
- How they feel that they fit in within the club
- Other factors?

Over the year James ran 2 express courses attended by 13 in total, of this, only 2 continued on to full membership. This was not helped by the weather on the September course as many sessions had to be cancelled. However, I think that in the light of this, we should think carefully about the value of these courses as a way to encourage new members.

I anticipate that there will be fewer members at the beginning of the new season. I have received 3 cancelled memberships and, in addition, we had some members who stopped coming part way through the season and will not renew this coming year.

During the 2019/20 season the men entered one team in the summer Chaucer League. This is a league that we have played in for many seasons and we finished mid-table on this occasion. Over the winter we were lucky enough to be able to enter the Aldershot & District Winter league for the first time. This is a league that we have been keen to play as it offers a home and away fixture and has enabled us to keep our eye in over the long winter months. Entering for the 1st time has meant that we were placed in division 5. I am pleased to announce we topped the league on our 1st attempt, which sees us promoted to division 4 next year. In addition to this we also played the Surrey Wilson Winter League. This league I find much harder to organise fixtures as the captains are required to offer 3 dates to the opposition before a match can be scheduled.
