#### Ongoing maintenance:

# 9). Coaching report – Marc Squire

April 2019 to March 2020

# **Overview of Coaching**

The coaching programme at the Grove has 3 terms that coincide with the school terms. Term 1: April to July

Term 2: September to December

Term 3: January to March

Each term consists of 10 to 12 weeks of group coaching for juniors/adults, Tuesday to Saturday.

• Approx. 9 adult groups and 17 junior groups run per week

We also run tennis camps for juniors during the school holidays throughout the year

- 3 days during Easter holidays 2019
- 1 day Road to Wimbledon Tournament during May Half Term 2019
- 3 weeks of camps in the summer holidays 2019
- 3 days October Half Term 2019

\*No camps are run during the Christmas holidays and no camps were run during the February half term 2020

The numbers of junior and adults over the last couple of years has remained very consistent and the amount raised via non members attending all coaching (outlined above) has gone up from £2196 in 2018 to £3313 in 2019.

We have whatsapp groups for all coaching groups and these have proved useful for organisational purposes and for people to play outside of lessons.

### Tennis Leaders

In April 2019 we held a tennis leader course aimed at juniors ages 14+ to allow them to get on the coaching ladder; we had 10 juniors complete the course. This course is a valuable opportunity for the juniors to help the coaching team and feel more part of the club.

### Social and tennis Clinic

On the 20<sup>th</sup> July 2019 I ran a coaching clinic which was opened to all members and whose aim was to improve a particular aspect of their game. The clinic proved to be extremely popular and was attended by more than 20 members; it also constituted an opportunity for people to socialise and get to know each other.

### Men's coaching

Andy Rice and Paul Kent took over the running of the Sunday morning training sessions in the summer term 2019 and are continuing to do so. From September 2019 the men's coaching session moved to a Wednesday evening.

### Family Social on Sundays

This is an allocated slot where families can come together and play. In order to raise awareness among the members, the first session was coach led. The event very successful, 35 players turned up! After the first session not many people continued taking advantage of the slot.

### **Coaches**

Thomas Butler was working with the team full time over the Summer 2019, until September when he started his university degree.

Callum Forsyth (Level 3 coach) joined the team in July 2019, along with Joe Lampon our singles champion 2019 (level 2 coach).
