Club Facilities

Gate Access and Courts

Gate access to our 4 floodlit courts is via an access code which is changed regularly and communicated via email. Courts 1 and 2 are directly in front of the pavilion and 3 and 4 to its left. The 1 mini-court is free and open to all on a first come basis and tennis racquets for this court can be borrowed from the Clubhouse.

Floodlights

These are free as part of your membership and can be switched on and off via meters allocated to each court in the entrance hut. Use is at your discretion, and we expect you to turn them off after use. (On courts 3 and 4 one floodlight has a courtesy light fitted which will stay on for about 5 minutes after the other floodlights go out). Lights cannot be used beyond 10pm due to local planning restrictions and of course, courtesy to our neighbours.

<u>Tennis balls</u>

These are free as part of your membership. The balls will be kept inside the Clubhouse in the tall cupboard near the kitchen. We kindly ask that you return the balls after use. The balls will be checked and replaced regularly by our committee member Jayne Dempster. The green bin outside the Pavilion entry door can be used to place used tennis balls for recycling.


The Pavilion

The Pavilion is open to all members. Like gate access, the code to the Pavilion keysafe is changed regularly and communicated to members separately. The kitchen, changing room and toilet are for your use and we simply ask for donations towards coffee, teas and cakes. While we do have a cleaner, we would ask you to keep the premises (and especially the washing up) in good order. Rubbish is collected and taken away by volunteers. 
Booking a Court

The Club uses the ClubSpark system, an online booking facility which enables you to book a court for free (guests are required to pay £4 when booking). Access to ClubSpark is via one-off online registration and then via your chosen password. You can book a court 14 days ahead for a maximum of 1.5 hours.

Coaching

<u>Adults</u>

Jörg (photo left) and Keith (photo right) are our two LTA Licensed Level 4 qualified coaches. Jörg Schlüter is the Head Coach at our club. Keith Brown works alongside Jörg and runs most of our mini tennis sessions. Keith is also a Licensed LTA Official Referee Grade R4 and regularly runs competitions at the Club, mainly for junior players. Keith is also a UKRSA Registered Professional Stringer.

Juniors

There is a thriving junior section at the Club with regular coaching sessions, holiday camps, fun competitions, an annual tournament and matches against local clubs.

The mini-court is always open to members and their children. Children can also play on the larger courts that should be booked in the usual manner via the HTC web site or directly via Clubspark.

It is a good idea for juniors to play with the coloured balls recommended by the LTA, i.e., red balls for 8U, orange balls 9U and green balls for 10U (talk to one of the coaches about these balls). Juniors usually progress to standard yellow balls at around age 11.

If juniors happen to be playing on a court when a coach is present, they will be happy to lend them some coloured balls according to their level.

Jörg, with Keith, normally coaches Mini Red, Mini Orange, Mini Green and Junior Yellow Ball on Friday afternoons/early evenings. During school holidays the coaching team often hold Tennis Camps, Tournaments and other extra coaching opportunities.

Throughout the year juniors are encouraged to participate in local LTA tournaments whatever their level; firstly, it's great fun and, secondly, it's a fantastic way to improve their tennis skills as they learn to play against others whose styles and tactics may be less familiar than their friends'.

Club Sessions

There are two types of club sessions; 'turn up and play' and organised social sessions. All standards are very welcome and we try to mix players within their ability.

General Club Rules

Henfield Tennis Club is fully committed to the safety and well-being of all its members, and believes that it is important that members, coach, administrators and parents associated with the Club should, at all times, show respect and understanding for the safety and welfare of others. Members are encouraged to share any concerns or complaints that they may have about any aspect of the Club with a member of the committee.

The Terms and Conditions of membership including the latest Club's Regulations and Codes of Conduct can be found on the website. The current Regulations are attached to this document.



REGULATIONS OF HENFIELD TENNIS CLUB (agreed at Committee Meeting on 26 Jan 2024)

- 1. All courts, including the mini-court, are open for play from 8 a.m. to 10 p.m. inclusive.
- 2. Floodlights may be used only between 8 a.m. and 10 p.m. inclusive.

3. The Committee is able to close courts to Members and to the general public for maintenance or for special reasons such as matches, tournaments or hiring to local schools or other outside bodies. Wherever possible a notice is displayed at least seven (7) days prior to the closure.

4. The Committee reserves courts for regular club sessions, coaching sessions etc. The current list of these reservations is displayed on the notice board outside the pavilion. The remaining courts are reserved in the following priority order:-

- a. By the Committee for matches, tournaments or hiring to local schools or other outside bodies,
- b. By the coaches for ad-hoc coaching sessions,
- c. By members up to 14 days in advance,
- d. By the general public up to 7 days in advance.

All bookings are through the Clubspark website.

5. The mini-court is open to everyone, members and the public, and is accessible without going through the tennis club premises. It cannot be booked, and should be vacated after 30 minutes if others are waiting to play.

6. Whenever possible, Club tournament matches should be played outside of club sessions, but in any case no more than one such match shall take place during any one Club session.

Code of Conduct

- 7. Members and visitors are expected to behave considerately, including:-
 - showing respect at all times to other players, club officials and our neighbours;
 - not abusing, being neglectful, harming or discriminating against anyone;
 - being inclusive and celebrating diversity; and
 - helping keep everyone safe by reporting any concerns to the welfare officer or other committee member.
- 8. Members and visitors should protect and take care of club property, including:-
 - wearing appropriate shoes and clothing;
 - leaving the clubhouse and courts clean and tidy after use;
 - reporting any damage or problems relating to security to the committee;
 - if the last person to leave the clubhouse, checking that the water, lights and heating are off and that the pavilion is locked and secure;
 - if the last person to leave the courts, turning the floodlights off;
 - if the last person to leave the premises, closing and padlocking the external gate.
- 9. Members and visitors should make the club a welcoming and friendly environment by:-

- enjoying the game;
- playing by the rules of tennis and
- abiding by the Rules and Regulations of HTC.
- 10. Members and visitors should have consideration for the health and safety of themselves and others by:-
 - following any instructions relating to safety, given by club officials either orally or in writing notices emails etc;
 - not playing if unfit in any way to do so;
 - ensuring conditions are safe before play and not playing if conditions are unsafe e.g. the courts are slippery because of the weather;
 - not undertaking maintenance and other such tasks without proper regard to health and safety e.g. wearing appropriate PPE if needed.
- 11. Juniors under the age of 13 are to be supervised by an appropriate adult. Juniors are welcome to play in events with their parents permission. Adult members should be aware when they are playing with a Junior and behave appropriately.

Notes:

- **The Rules** (the constitution) cannot be altered except at a General Meeting after due notice, and then only provided that two thirds of those present and voting are in favour.
- The Regulations (including codes of conduct) are made and periodically revised by the Committee.
