Covid 19

MARCH 29TH 2021 Play can resume!! We are permitted to play singles; doubles and Club Play Social Sessions may resume. The rule of 6 must be observed with hand hygiene and social distancing at all times. Please review the current rules for play which will be updated on the website as we get closer to reopening.

Access to the clubhouse remains restricted to toilet use or turning on/off the floodlights on a “one person in one out” basis. Please DO NOT fill water bottles or use any of the kitchen facilities and ensure that you continue to bring enough refreshments with you when playing.

The club has invested in a more robust hand sanitizers for members use to promote a safe return to play.

It remains a requirement that you sign the register when you attend club play sessions.

World Tennis Number:

A new rating system will be launched this spring to replace the British Tennis rating system. The WTN will be a world wide rating system and will be amended weekly. Kent League matches, club tournament and other matches within the club can count towards this number. Doubles and singles matches will count. Match results must be entered on the LTA Results Manager System. Members holding a British Tennis number will receive an email when the system is launched. It will enable players to team up with another player of a similar standard regardless of gender, worldwide!

This is aimed to support clubs and encourage competition. Training on the system will become available on the LTA website. www.lta.org.uk

Fees for the 2021-22 Season

There has been a small restructuring of our fees, but no increase in cost from 2019-20. This can be viewed on our website. **Fees will become due on the 1st April 2021.** Existing members will receive an email when renewal is due.

Maintenance

Our courts were professionally cleaned by ETC under our court maintenance agreement on the 24th Feb and are looking in great condition ready for play to resume. The committee chose the surface, MatchPlay 2, because it is low maintenance, with no brushing required after play. It drains well and can be played on in all weather conditions. The courts will take time to bed in and you may find some uneven bounces for a while. They behave differently with various spins, sitting up with topspin and sliding through with slice. When the surface is damp the balls will slide through quickly and pick up water from the surface. It will take time to determine the best balls for this surface and this may differ from winter to summer. Please try and use all 6 courts evenly to help the bedding in process.

Please make sure you respect these wonderful facilities at all times by keeping the courts, picnic area and clubhouse clean and clear of rubbish. Also the security of our site is dependent on all members taking responsibility for locking the clubhouse, turning off your court lights and ensuring the main gate closes when they leave. The committee would be grateful if members were available to assist with general maintenance such as leaf removal, weed and moss killing of the picnic area and land surrounding the courts when required.

Thanks to members who have volunteered to help with maintenance.

Housekeeping!

A Defibrillator has been fixed to the outside wall of the clubhouse facing the tennis courts. We hope that the need to use it never arises. However, should it do so there are clear instructions inside the case.

There is no vehicular access to the tennis club. There is a barrier across the entrance to the car park that is kept locked overnight. The code will be given to members on booking a court. Please ensure that you close and lock the barrier if you are the last car to leave the car park at any time of day and lock the padlock back onto the barrier if you have opened it when arriving early. We suggest you bring waterproofs if rain is forecast, as the car park is a distance away!
