A history

When was the tennis club established?

The Essex Record Office (ERO) holds some records which confirm the club was formed in 1892 as Ingatestone Tennis Club, becoming Ingatestone & Fryerning TC in 1894 it seems. The ERO holds some records of club minutes and an AGM from the late 1890s.

In these early days a Mr Gray, Mr Upton and Mr Crowe are recorded as Club vice-presidents. The latter was Cecil Hervey Crowe, who died in 1916 in the Sinai aged 43 with the NZEF (Canterbury Mounted Rifles) and who has a memorial in Ingatestone Church.

At a meeting in or around 1896/1898 Mr Raven proposed that the club establish their own "colours", and the task of determining these was delegated to the "lady members".

(It appears that women's involvement in tennis and other sports, plus a growing middle class with more leisure time in the late Victorian era, were important drivers in the development of the game).

At an AGM on 10th May 1897 present were Miss Maud Smith, Miss E Raven, Miss E Hone, Miss Ada French, Reverend Earle as Chairman (also vicar of Ingatestone until 1918), Messrs. GJ Smith, C Howell (Secretary), H Welton, JW Gallagher. Club President was Colonel Wood.

The club accounts showed a balance of £3/7s/7d, plus tournament fees of 8 shillings from the 1896 event, which had not been completed.

The location of the club in those early years is unclear, but is likely to have been on a private court at one of the large local houses.

Around 1912 two courts were constructed at Fairfield, just south-west of the cricket pavilion. (Two plateaux can still be seen there to this day). At the same time, the Bowling Club was formed, situated by the railway bridge. The club remained there until the end of World War II, at which time it is possible the courts had fallen into disrepair.

In or around 1947, three grass courts were laid at the Working Men's Club in the High Street – close to the current site. They remained there through the 1950s and 1960s, and can be seen on some aerial photos from that time.

(In 1959 there were also the first hard courts in the village at the Secondary School in Willow Green, but these were lost to the new Anglo European School block in the 2000s).

Now read on...

1970 Tennis Club goes into hibernation for 2 years, as the land on which the grass courts were located had been sold.

1972 Doe Contracts Ltd lay hard courts 1 & 2 at rear of 7 High Street, Ingatestone. A meeting was held at 48 Willow Green on 22nd September to discuss the club revival. Mr & Mrs G Bacon, Mr & Mrs C Bishop, Mr & Mrs R Pain and Mr & Mrs B Shedel attended. The above-named would act as a caretaker committee with Mr Pain as Chair & Treasurer and Mr Bishop as Secretary

The Ingatestone & Fryerning Community Club (IFCC) Newsletter from that year confirms that, thanks to the generosity of the Club, new members, of all standards, are being invited to join the tennis club on these new courts behind the car park, club & library building. Notices inviting application were to be displayed in the village. The tennis pavilion was relocated and renovated.

It was agreed as reasonable by the caretaker committee that, in accordance with the IFCC conditions, the tennis club membership be open only to IFCC members.

Adult membership £4.50 p.a. (exclusive of IFCC membership fee) Juniors (aged 11 to 17) £1.50. Adults had priority for play on Saturdays and Sundays after 2pm., and on summer weekdays after 7pm. Juniors under 14 had to be accompanied by an adult. Proper tennis shoes should be worn, and members normally played in white apparel.

There were special arrangements for coaching in the summer holidays and at other times.

The tennis club supplied tennis balls.
Visitors welcome on payment of a fee.
Club contacts were Richard Pain, 9 Willow Green and C. Bishop, 24 Pine Drive.



1973 September / November. Pro-rata membership proposed for those joining later in the year. The house in Pine Drive behind Court 1 had refused to return some 3 dozen tennis balls. It was decided to investigate raising the height of the back netting, but the cost of £142 needed more consideration and should only be a last resort. Richard Pain to write to neighbours to apologise for any inconvenience.

As at November, Committee comprised: Chair - Richard Pain, Vice-Chair - Geoffrey Bacon, Secretary - Cliff Bishop, Treasurer - Lyndon Day, Jean Lewis.

1974 February. Draft club rules drawn up. Application made to affiliate to Essex LTA (and approved). Drag broom to be purchased.

The IFCC newsletter of March 1974 reports that the first full season (1973) on the new hard courts was enjoyed by some 120 adult & junior members. The weekend turnout was somewhat disappointing as many members preferred to play during the week "when there are fewer eyes to watch their endeavours to recapture lost form after being dragged out of early retirement by their enthusiastic children".

An American tournament had been held on what was probably one of the hottest days of the summer and was a resounding success and thoroughly enjoyed by all. The winners were Angela Marks and Reg Isherwood and the runners-up Sally & Simon Bevan. (*Editor's note: In 2012, it is understood that Angela was living in Margareting, and she loaned her own tennis court to us for after-school coaching in two recent summers*).

It was hoped to recommence the knockout championships in the summer (but see 1976, below). The 1959 men's singles champion had yet to return the trophy, and it was speculated that he might have pawned it!

"Ladies Days" had been held on Wednesdays in 1973 and had become very popular by the summer's end. The hardier females had already commenced activities this year.

Dorothy Reynolds, "our very able coach", had held three coaching courses for junior members. These were over-subscribed so it was hoped to arrange further sessions in 1974 to accommodate those who missed out.

Club Secretary, Cliff Bishop encouraged new members.

June. 51 adult and 44 junior members.

July. American tournament planned for 7th July.

1975 Proposals that membership fees be fixed at £5 for adults (18+) and £1 juniors (age 14-17). Adults encouraged to join IFCC. Junior membership for those aged between 11 and 13 restricted to children of adult members.

AGM (March)

Electricity installation had not been proceeded with due to cost.

Junior coaching had been successful in the summer holidays.

Membership figures remained fairly constant – 59 adults 63 juniors.

Expenses incurred in maintenance of pavilion and buying a broom. However income exceeded expenditure by £42.81 and balance sheet showed a credit of £207.09.

Junior coaching planned for August.

Tournaments had been planned for July and September, but didn't proceed.

October. Cliff Bishop resigns as club secretary from next AGM, due to "lack of support and club feeling amongst members".

The bowling green was to be completed and there were plans for a new shared pavilion.

Opinion divided on the relationship with IFCC – whether to maintain independence or be a "tennis section".

Agreed in principle to work closely with IFCC.

1976 The pavilion is re-erected after storm damage. Some damage also to bowling green. Knockout championships arranged again for the first time since 1959. Possibility of a joint pavilion with the bowls club is discussed, but no definite decisions reached.

AGM (February)

31 members attended.

Ladies' Days on Wednesdays were well-attended and junior coaching sessions continued. However there was disappointment that the club had not flourished as hoped for, particularly at weekends. The regular club night had been poorly attended. Two tournaments were cancelled due to lack of support.

Subscriptions: 2 parents & children £12.50, 1 parent & children £7.50, adults £5, juniors £2.50.

Annual tournament proposed.

Saturday afternoons to be designated as club afternoon.

A springtime social function was proposed, to enable members to meet each other.

The bowling club proposes laying on electricity and water, utilities being extended to the tennis pavilion, with costs shared equally. Separate metering was considered essential.

1977 IFTC to donate £5 to the village's Silver Jubilee celebrations.

AGM attended by 41 members. Attendance helped by also making it a social gathering.

March. Members were requesting American tournaments and specific club sessions. Tuesday evenings to be a regular "club evening". Junior committee to be considered.

1976 storm damage costs had been covered by insurance claim paid.

July. Some complaints of junior members' behaviour.

Pavilion roof beyond repair – new roof agreed up to a cost of £100.

September. Junior committee was operating successfully. High number of junior members needed careful managing. Maximum of 100 to be set.

American tournaments had been very popular in the summer, and another in October.

Electricity is installed in the pavilion.

1978 January. The Boys' Club had asked to use the courts once a fortnight in summer evenings. Agreed, subject to strict supervision.

Treasurer reported income exceeded expenditure by £208.05.

Junior lower age limit recommended to be 12.

Subscriptions to be proposed: 2 parents & children £15, 1 parent & children £9, adults £6, juniors £3.

April. Discretion to admit juniors over 16 to full adult membership. Junior members to be limited to 100.

Bowling Club requested permission to park a "toilet caravan" next to the pavilion. To be further discussed.

May. IFCC advise they are about to seek planning permission for two squash courts at the rear of the car park (near where Court 3 is now situated).

June

Juniors beat Southend in Essex under-18s event.

July

Bowling Club toilet removed due to lack of planning permission.

Income exceeds expenditure by £120.30. Adult membership down from 78 to 65.

Juniors lost to Connaught in a recent home match in Essex under-18s.

American tournament in June was attended by 20 members.

August American event very successful. It was envisaged that events would be held on the last Sunday every month, weather permitting.

September

David Crisp joined the committee.

Discussions with Bowling Club re a shared pavilion.

IFCC had (it seemed) gained planning permission for 2 squash courts, but there would still be space for a 3rd tennis court.

1979 January. IFCC had a surplus of £5,000. Possible projects discussed – 3rd tennis court or joint pavilion with bowling club. Squash courts now refused permission!
Excess of expenditure over income of £32 due to increased rent & maintenance costs.

April. “Mr Bert Smith” would continue to do gardening. A working party was needed to paint the pavilion and the court lines. A table and a kettle were needed. The fluorescent light in the pavilion had come away from its mountings.

A vote at the AGM showed members’ support for a 3rd court before a new pavilion.

May. 62 adult and 60 junior members. Juniors remain limited to 100. Club was breaking even financially. To rejoin the ECLTA.

July. Reports of bad behaviour by juniors.

Chair, Richard Pain to relinquish his post at the end of the year.

1980 February. Stuart Heath to be in charge of tournaments. Allan Pegg i/c of maintenance. Geoff Perry i/c of matches. Leslie Peters to continue as Treasurer. Cliff Bishop willing to return to committee – possibly as secretary.

1981 January. It was considered that there had been no further deterioration in “standards of dress”, but an appeal would be made to members at the AGM.

Leslie Peters to stand down as Treasurer. Rest of committee to continue. Ron Lewis as Chair.

March. Easter and summer coaching to be organised for juniors. Friendly matches had been arranged for ladies, and the possibility of matches for men and mixed teams was being investigated with Mountnessing and Gidea Park TCs.

Enquiries were being made about friendly matches with “Ingatestone’s twin town” – Roth, in Germany.

Paul Hiscock to organise pavilion repairs and line painting. Bert Smith to put down paving stones between the bowling green huts and through to the gate.

May. 98 adults and 111 juniors had paid their subscriptions. The maximum number of members is restricted to 125 adults and 125 juniors.

Non-members had been observed playing. A notice would be displayed reminding members of the guest fee of £0.25p.

Ingatestone ladies beat Mountnessing 8-6.

June. American tournament had an attendance of only 11 members. Poor weather may have been a factor.

July. A window of an adjoining house had been broken. Repair cost is £23.

Ladies lose to Mountnessing 6-3, but beat Gidea Park 6-2.

Bert Smith required extra top soil to level the grass around the pavilion.

Two successful summer American events and various junior and senior friendly matches had taken place.

October. Various complaints received about bad language and vandalism by young people. A resident complained of pebbles being thrown and breaking a window.

A new soakaway was required to deal with water draining from the Bowling Club shed roof.

1982 February. The question of a 3rd court continued to be discussed. Mike Bysouth & Simon Wills to jointly organise all tournaments this year.

Jean Heath to take over organisation of ladies' matches from Lilian Pegg.

Bert Smith continues to cut the grass @ £1.50 an hour.

March. Lynne Abbott recruited as junior coach, for a fee of £5 per hour plus petrol costs.

Membership reaches 257 Members (*still the highest total on record as at 2021 – Ed*). In the IFCC Newsletter "The Clubster" in November, it was reported that membership was up by 10% over the last two years, and that there was an equal number of adults and under-18s. Specific mention is made of 2 outstanding juniors in the 12/13 year-old category – Simon Kelly & Richard Hallett. (*Editor's note: I understand that the second-named went on to some success – including being Mountnessing TC singles champion six times in the 1990s and also picking up a number of doubles titles there*).

There were American tournaments from April through to October, and an annual tournament with a successful and happy Finals' Day. The two hard courts were being fully used, and it was hoped to soon provide a third court. It would be difficult to accommodate more members at this time, but nevertheless the Treasurer (Mr G.Perry, 4 Pine Drive) would welcome any enquiries.

December. £179.50 spent on pavilion repairs had been very good value.

1983 March. Friendly discussions with Bowling Club about the possibility of a new pavilion. Bowling Club had no funds but the IFCC would provide one-third of the cost.

IFCC commented on IFTC members not frequenting the bar; also they were opposed to IFTC using their loo.

IFCC priority was to resurface and extend car park rather than fund a 3rd tennis court.

Juniors not to be accepted at American events, except if numbers were short.

Mountnessing TC had 2 courts out of action for a few weeks, so their members might use IFTC courts at £0.50 a time.

August. Membership 120 adults and 105 juniors.

Ron Lewis to stand down as Chair, and Geoff Perry as Treasurer.

1984 February.

Jean Heath now Chair, Lois Morton Secretary, Kate Hiscock Treasurer.

June. The Chair to offer Richard Pain, a founder member of the club, life membership for £25.

August. The Chair had heard of a scheme to redevelop the car park and tennis courts (into a larger car park?) and for a site at the end of Docklands Avenue to be developed for housing plus 4 tennis courts and a clubhouse.

November. Discussions with Brentwood Council (BBC) covered the following points: Converting the tennis courts into a car park and the possibility of building 2 courts on Seymour Field; The funding of court resurfacing; The drainage problem.

December. Club receives a quote to resurface courts for £5,300. To relocate to Seymour Field, by the by-pass, would cost £50,000 plus pavilion costs.

1985

January.

The Ladies' Singles Cup is stolen from Deirdre Kemble's house. Its value between £100 and £200. Deirdre generously agrees to replace it.

BBC give suggestions re a loan or grant for resurfacing and creating a 3rd court. They recommend pursuing a long lease from the IFCC. (April 1985 - the IFCC not willing to grant a lease).

The need for a 3rd court stressed by club Chair Jean Heath due to having 131 senior and 103 junior members. Estimated cost of resurfacing and creating a new court was £17,687. Resurfacing & new fencing only would be £8,612.

July/August – BBC agree to contribute towards the cost of having existing courts resurfaced (first recorded as necessary at 1979 AGM). Amongst the conditions is that certain car park works take place, that BBC be able to use the IFCC car park as a public car park, that IFTC undertake that the courts remain available for tennis for a reasonably long period and that the public would not be debarred from joining the club, and that the Tennis Club takes over responsibility for maintenance. To be hard courts, as artificial grass stated to be too expensive.

August. A tennis ball causes damage to glass in a Pine Drive rear garden. The tennis club pays the cost of £1.98.

Barn Dance at Mountnessing Village Hall was successful. 100 tickets had sold quite quickly. Profit of £275.

November. Jill Tomes, Kate Hiscock and Mike Bysouth to stay on committee, although Mike to cease being tournament organiser. Paul Hiscock to retire from committee.

1986

February. Neil Macalister to organise club tournaments with Mike Bysouth's help.

Club play had dwindled over the last year, but we would persist with Sunday mornings, Tuesday evenings and Wednesday mornings for ladies.

It was suggested that juniors should receive one warning for bad behaviour, but after that lose their membership.

March/April – Doe Sport Ltd resurface both courts, paid by BBC. New third court for public use is built at the same time. Estimated 7-10 years before resurfacing needed.

Some haggling over fees payable to IFCC. £400 agreed. Bowling Club pay only £200, but it was argued that they only play 6 months of the year, and they use the IFCC bar!

IFTC made a surplus of £1,400 last year, and thus we could afford the IFCC fee.

Some members had not paid their individual IFCC fees.

Discussions on getting a new or renovated clubhouse.

May – works needed to treat persistent thistles pushing up through the new surface. Courts described as slippery, but Doe advise should be resolved shortly, once courts used in dry weather.

June – Some discussion at committee about entering local leagues. Some were in favour. Some (Chair and Secretary) were opposed as it would change IFTC from being a "village family club" and those who sought more competitive play could join Mountnessing or Billericay TCs etc.

July – Doe express concerns about chairs being placed on the courts, causing indentations.

Poor drainage becomes a serious problem (*Ed: still unresolved in 1989... and indeed 2014!*). Doe suggest creating a new soakaway. High water table was an issue.

September – A card to be sent to Wolfgang Weigel, a longstanding member who was moving away.

November – Quotation of £10,996 for new clubhouse considered unaffordable.
Poor response to American tournaments this year.

December - Southern Sectionals quote for a new clubhouse, a “Sunningdale” cabin. Cost similar to other quote once all extras added in.

1987 March – It was suggested that an aggregate total kept of all games won at American events in the year, and the overall champion to receive a small prize.
A 10-year lease to be requested from IFCC.

Solicitors (Wortley, Byers & Co) advise the Club on 21st April that “neither the Community Association (CA), nor IFTC are, at law, in a position to grant or take a lease of the premises”. This position is reiterated by the CA in their letter to IFTC 1st June.

June – Decision to refurbish existing clubhouse rather than provide a new one which might be at risk if IFCC should have other plans for the site.

July - New nets in place for finals' day. Drainage problems continue.

October – Barn Dance planned at IFCC.

1988 January – Decided to just install a toilet rather than carry out more extensive works.
Mike Bysouth to leave committee. Nick Austin to stay as Treasurer. Neil Macalister to continue as tournament organiser. Sally Wills, Kate Wills & Deirdre Kemble to remain. Jean Heath to step down as Chair. Jean Lewis to take on that role for just one year. New committee members – Sue Alcock, Dot Thornton, John Heath & Ron Went.
Longstanding member and former treasurer, Geoff Perry, was to leave the area.

February. Doe quote for new fencing at £1,245 + VAT.

Membership lists computerised. Clubhouse renovated and decorated.

July – membership, 134 adults, 89 juniors.

October – Barn Dance in Mountnessing was a great success with a profit of £276.

1989 February. BBC advises that the lack of a piped surface water drainage system is the problem. An estimated cost of remedial works to provide additional gullies and enlarge the soakaway to assist in drainage would be in the region of £1,500, which would not be within their budget.

Introduction of padlock & key. Introduction of £5 discount for early joining.
Cupboard created for lawnmower.

Chair is now Jill Tomes; Dot Thornton is Secretary and Ron Went Treasurer. Also on committee Sue Alcock, Lorraine Heath, Sally Wills, Kate Wills, Neil Macalister, Nick Austin, David Cook.

April - Water supply has now been separated from the Bowling Club and IFTC has own stopcock.
Sunday mornings well-attended again.

June – A successful quiz night had taken place.

The Bowman family present the club with a rustic seat. (*still being enjoyed 30+ years later! – Ed*).

De facto discontinued the practice of setting subscription levels at the AGM.

October – 17 members attended extraordinary meeting to discuss new clubhouse plans initiated by the Bowling Club. Three options identified: A – Agree, but note we would lose all grass up to the baseline area. (Bowling Club had around 60 active members, the tennis club perhaps 15, so all decision-making would likely be dominated by the former); B – Reject; C – Accept a reduced scheme; Mixed feelings, but generally agreed to look to the future, provided new clubhouse wasn't too big and we didn't lose the grass. Possibility of lottery grant.

1999 AGM (January):

- *Women's Team played 20 friendly matches, winning 9.*

June. Doe provide some quotations for new courts (2 artificial grass @ £24,600 + VAT) and various quotes for washing or resurfacing existing courts.

October

November

Due to the reversion to a membership year running from April to March, next AGM is scheduled for 7th February 2013.

Repair & maintenance works to be scheduled, including fixing of basin in WC, replacing broken window, insulating pipework and other plumbing matters. September

Consideration to be given to who might be an assistant coach to Hal from next summer as the current incumbent, David Bohn, is set to go away to University.

Solutions being sought to the problem of repeated flooding near the entrance, and which often extends to Court 1 in wet weather. Discussions to take place with Bowling Club. Consideration to be given to obtaining a pump. A long-term solution may come as & when new clubhouse development takes place. (In this regard, a meeting to take place with a surveyor re preparation of provisional plans).

A few recent incidents of the court gates and/or clubhouse door being found unlocked, and still concerns about rubbish being left on the premises and, at times, bad language.

Frames to be purchased in order that the certificates for the league teams' recent successes may be displayed in the clubhouse. (Duly purchased and installed December 2013).

Website development to be progressed, with a developer to be nominated imminently.

2014

January

Meeting with Bowling Club & a surveyor re preparing a provisional feasibility design for new clubhouse(s).

February

In common with many tennis clubs in Essex, IFTC agree to bestow honorary membership on Clive Rippon who has been LTA Essex County Secretary for 40 years.

April

October

November

December

For next summer's league matches, it has been decided to enter one men's team (of 6 players) in the Chelmsford League (CDLTF) and, after 13 seasons, to withdraw our two teams for now from the Brentwood League (BDLTA). David Butt to be captain.

A new captain for the summer mixed team is sought. The Match Secretary will keep an eye on things in the meantime.

2015

January

Contractors have been selected to carry out moss treatment works. Works commenced 24th January and were completed in February.

7th January – With great sadness, the death was announced of longstanding club member, former women's captain and six times club doubles champion Ellen Gormley (1952-2015). A central figure in the club over the last two decades and indeed in local community life. The funeral took place on Friday 23rd January 2015, at St. Mary the Virgin Church in Fryerning, followed by a gathering at the Ivy Hill Hotel. Several hundred mourners attended and the church was bursting at the seams. There were some 17 IFTC members there, including all of the Committee, and 4 former members, plus at least 13 from Mountnessing TC. The Club provided flowers in the shape of a tennis racket, and we aim to pay some tributes to her at the AGM. For those who would like to make a charitable donation, the family has set up a page for

AGM (11th February):

- *Chair reported on highlights, such as the successful Open Day in 2014, the launch of the impressive website, the clubhouse makeover and the grant of £1,600 from the local Council which will be used to purchase windbreaks, a new noticeboard and hard landscaping improvements adjacent to the car park.*
- *The chair is acting as Treasurer pro tem. He reported on a loss of £1,434 in the last yearly accounting period; this was mainly as a result of a fall in income from membership and coaching, increased expenditure on court maintenance including new rear fencing plus the costs associated with an underground water leak.*

- *A tribute was made to Ellen – her husband Bernard, daughter Sara and son Leon were in attendance and presented trophies to the club tournament winners. There was also a nice photographic display featuring Ellen over her years at the club.*

March

A new social tennis session was introduced – 2pm on Thursday afternoons. In its initial weeks there was a good attendance, but numbers have fallen somewhat in April.

April

Results have come in for the SFWL winter season 2015/15. We were not terribly successful in this campaign.

The Men's I team, having risen from Division 7 to Division 3 over the last five seasons, (not unexpectedly) struggled with a lack of players and tough competition for most of the season, and finished bottom of Division 3 with only one win. Seven of the fourteen matches were unplayed or conceded.

The Men's II team fared slightly better in Division 6, winning 2 matches and ending up one from bottom.

Both teams are likely to be relegated.

For next season we need to decide whether we can sustain two men's teams.

The Mixed team played one match only before it was decided not to proceed in the league for that season.

The Tuesday evening social tennis resumed now that the lighter evenings have arrived. Up to 20 players have been attending.

The club has applied to join a new, informal, daytime midweek "seniors" league. We will have a mixed doubles team and play against a number of other clubs in the Chelmsford area – probably on Monday and Tuesday mornings.

The summer league matches commenced, with one men's team, one women's and one mixed – all in the CDLTF.

On 26th April the first of the traditional 7 annual "American" tournaments took place. There were 16 participants and a fair few visitors and spectators. The various colourful bunting was brought out of hibernation.

May

The club devises a "tennis quiz" paper which will go on sale throughout the summer at £1 a sheet, with a prize of £25 for the winner.

June

The annual Open Day takes place, on 28th June. A good turnout for the morning coaching and mini-tennis, the speed gun challenge and barbecue, despite some light rain in the middle of the day. 20 players then took part in the American event in the afternoon. A presentation is made to Head Coach Hal Kannor, and award of honorary club membership, following his announcement that he will not be able to continue with Saturday coaching due to family and other commitments. New coaching arrangements are to be announced shortly.

A Members' Survey is carried out. 17 responses are received, with a majority keen for Sunday morning activities such as "Cardio Tennis", tactical sessions and social play.

27 September - plans on display for the possible new clubhouse - we welcome comments from members.

October

11 October - new Sunday morning Cardio Tennis & Doubles Tactics sessions commence.

18 October - The 9th Annual Pink American tournament raised £141.74 for the breast cancer charity. At the event we remembered our late friend Ellen, and were delighted to see her family in attendance as we placed a framed photo in the clubhouse. Her husband Bernard presented the prizes and kindly donated two bottles of wine to the overall winners. The prize for the pinkest person went to David Kinch, who as far as we could establish did not have a single non-pink item of clothing on.

The overall American champion for 2015 was Kevin Wheeler with 99 games won, followed by Nita Grainge on 90, Will Jefferies on 89 and Liz Wyatt (the winner on the day) on 86.

Congratulations to Kevin, Nita, Clare Wheeler, Ben Roche and John Galvin who participated in all 7 events this year.

21 October – Inspection of club premises by the Water Board.

Nick arranges a racket testing and equipment morning on 24th October, hosted by Original Sports of Leigh-on-Sea. Adults and juniors can try out the latest rackets, browse clothing and other accessories and benefit from a free racket gripping service.

A new coaching initiative - a half-term junior camp on 26, 28 & 30 October.

Results are received for the summer's Chelmsford league matches.

The men finish 3rd, despite winning more matches than any other team in their division. They are only 4 points short of promotion.

The women finish 5th, the same as last year, a good achievement when one considers the players who have been lost to the side or relatively unavailable this summer.

The mixed team were in a very close division, with only 5 points separating the promotion and relegation zones.

Ingatestone avoid relegation by a mere half a point.

All 3 of our teams should stay in the same divisions for Summer 2016.

A curious discovery when we were getting the tournament trophies engraved. We discover that the winners' names engraved on the mixed doubles cup for the years 1986-1994 are different from the winners shown on the club honours board and in our archives. Further research is carried out. We discover that the names on the cup for this period actually relate to a separate autumn / winter mixed event which took place in that period. At some stage in the late 1990s the winter mixed cup became used for the main summer mixed tournament. An explanatory note has been added to the statistical historical archive.

November

High winds cause the new windbreaks to damage the fencing and fence posts between Court 3 and the car park. Assessment of the remedial works needed is being carried out.

A survey of members to be carried out to gauge the level of support for possible future club developments.

Plans to hold a Quiz Night as part of general fundraising initiatives.

Discussions on obtaining club branded clothing, especially for juniors and the coaching staff.

December

19th – Xmas coaching special. After the "holiday period", coaching due to resume Saturday 16th and Tuesday 19th January.

20th – Nick hosts an external junior mini-tennis tournament. In the younger group Hayden Bonnington won against Daisy Edwards. In the older group Jemima Ling triumphed in a close 3-set battle against Reggie Edwards.

2016

9 January - We aimed to re-launch the Singles Ladder, with a handicap system to make it more of a "level playing field". All members invited to enter. But things are placed on hold due to insufficient interest.

9 January - Members' Survey is issued, in order to obtain comments on the possible future development of facilities like a new clubhouse and/or floodlighting. Some lengthy and articulate replies were received with most respondents favouring the prioritisation of floodlighting. The Committee unanimously agree to progress things.

A new formula is agreed for membership fees in respect of new members joining part way through a year. Those joining in October to December to pay 50% of the full rate; those joining January to March to pay 25%.

7 February. Nick holds a free trial session of "Touch Tennis" for members & non-members. (Touch Tennis is a simplified alternative to the mainstream game, which allows skilful play to flourish at the expense of power-hitting. Played on a reduced-size court with foam balls and shorter rackets, Touch Tennis' regulations aim to foster long, intense rallies, clever angle play and an energetic experience).

AGM (10th February):

- *The Chair reported on another successful Open Day, the excellent work from our previous coach Hal and new coach Nick's many initiatives and the ongoing commitment of assistant coaches Sam B & Will J., the continued development of the website & other social media usage, the grant-funded windbreaks and landscaping improvements & other enhancements, including the purchase of an umpire's chair & a basic scoreboard. Unfortunately the windbreaks created some problems in strong autumn winds and remedial works are required. Tribute was paid to the help provided in recent years (odd jobs, "phantom" gardening etc!) from Peter Wyatt, and it was noted that Peter & Liz would be moving away from the area in about 3 months' time.*
- *The Chair has been acting as Treasurer, with some help from our former Treasurer Carolyn Searle. Membership subscriptions down somewhat; coaching income up significantly but so is coaching expenditure; operational surplus of £1,622. Overall assets £28,654 as at September 2015 – this is healthy but insufficient to cover proposed developments.*
- *A 5% rise in membership fees is anticipated for 2016/17, and some increase in coaching fees, which had been frozen for the last two years.*
- *A very slight fall (4%) in the number of members this year to 91(47 seniors, 44 juniors)- the lowest total since records began, (although details are missing for a few years).*
- *Junior awards to members of coaching groups: Lexi McCallum, Hayden Bonnington, Ben Roche & Will Jefferies.*
- *This year there were no presentation of trophies to the tournament winners – in view of the long 5 –month gap between the finals' weekend and the AGM it had been decided it was better to present the cups immediately after the finals in September, otherwise the winners would only get to hold their trophy for just over half of the year.*
- *The Chair, Secretary and the existing Committee were unanimously re-elected.*
- *The Chair discussed possible future developments at the club. A consultation exercise had revealed that a majority of members favoured prioritising floodlighting, so this matter will be further progressed. At least two club members are keen to assist in the project.*
- *The question of drainage and flooding was discussed and one or two possible solutions came up, although it was noted that things had not been so bad this winter.*

Week commencing 22 February - Fencing works take place to remedy wind damage. A new club board and windbreak were installed in the second week of March.

March

Club members are issued with a procedure for rubbish disposal and keeping the premises clean and tidy.

Easter weekend coaching featured an Easter Egg hunt.

More strong winds cause some damage to the new fence posts, causing one to snap. Further remedial works to come in the week commencing 18th April.

April

Results come in for the SFWL. Ingatestone teams enjoy a good season. The men in Division 6 finish third, only 3 points short of promotion, while both the women's and mixed teams win their respective Division 5s with a bit to spare and move onwards and upwards. Overall Ingy teams win 20 and draw 3 out of 29 matches – a very high success rate. More details can be found in the "Records & Statistics" section.

May

22nd May saw a farewell presentation by the Club Chair John Galvin to two of our most regular and enthusiastic members, Liz & Peter Wyatt, who are moving out of the area to the bucolic charms of the Suffolk / Norfolk borders. They'll be much-missed, but we're sure they'll pop in and see us from time-to-time.

August

A new net is fitted to Court 1, the old one having seen better days.

September

The club championships took place, with one final on the 10th September, six on the 11th, and one delayed until the 17th.

On the 25th September the monthly American tournament was combined with a “fun day”, including a barbecue and “speed of serve” contest. Nick Hilder clocked the fastest serve, matching Jimmy Innes’s 87mph at last year’s open day. James Edwards & Robert Elsdon were not far behind, also exceeding 80mph.

October

20 players took part in the 10th annual “wear It Pink” Charity American tournament. Clare Wheeler and Kevin Wheeler were the highest scorers on the day. Chair John Galvin was nominated the “Pinkest Person”. Jean Holland won the “pink object wall” competition and generously donated her winnings to the charity. This was the 7th and last American event for 2016. Nick Hilder won the cup for the highest aggregate – 105 games won over the season – an all-time record.

Results are received for the summer’s Chelmsford league matches.

The men, in their 6-a-side league, finish top of Division 4, with only one defeat all summer, and are promoted, with Marconi II.

The women finish 5th for the third year running, but some 40 points adrift of the top teams.

Once again, the mixed team was in a very close division, with not that many points separating the promotion and relegation zones. We finish third, 2.5 short of promotion, 5 clear of relegation. Our total of 41 points is remarkably similar to the previous two seasons where we totalled 40.5 and 39.5.

Ingatestone win the CDLTF seniors’ Midweek Daytime League. Grove needed 7 points from their last match to overtake us but managed zero.

In the Brentwood League, Ingatestone men’s finish a strong 4th with 65 sets won in 14 matches.

November

Cecily Massey is co-opted as a new member of the club committee.

A revised version of the club’s Code of Conduct is produced.

Nicole Desbêtes & David Butt notify of their intention to stand down from the committee.

It is agreed to plant some climbing shrubs by the fence in the north-east corner.

An end-of-season club curry evening took place on the 30th November, with 21 members attending.

December

Brentwood Council have provided guidance on matters to be considered within any formal application which might be made re planning permission for floodlighting; the tennis club will be seeking professional advice in this regard.

The weekend of 17/18 December sees some seasonal coaching sessions, complete with snow machine.

2017

January

Jacinta Whitfield is proposed as a new member of the Committee.

There is to be some re-jigging of individual committee members’ roles.

An updated Health & Safety document is to be published shortly.

The old stock of club T-shirts & sweatshirts is on offer to members at a knock-down price.

It was reported that PAT (Portable Appliance Testing) of electrical items in the clubhouse had recently taken place by Andrew Jefferies.

February

A sub-committee is to meet to progress matters relating to floodlighting.

The club applies to enter the LTA Aegon Team Tennis competitions for Summer 2017, with an 8&under mini-tennis team and a men's team. (The men's team did well, coming in a strong 2nd place; The 8 & Under team won one match out of 4, but improved with every match).

Co-op Community Card Scheme

The tennis club has signed up to the Co-op card scheme, and Charlotte Jefferies has cards for any member who would like one. If you shop in any Co-op branch, including Quadrant in Chelmsford, for every pound spent the club gets points which can be cashed for fundraising activities. Co-op even donates 50% on top.

"Hurricane Doris" causes some damage to fencing. Some remedial repairs were carried out on 25th February, with more substantial ones to follow.

AGM (1st March):

- *The Chair reported on what was a typical year in many ways. We reached 99 members, and were urged to try and recruit more. There were 2 or 3 enjoyable curry nights and two league titles to celebrate.*
- *Nick had continued on the coaching front "unabated" – helped by Samuel Bromiley & Will Jefferies. A new initiative for 2017 would be an entry in the LTA's Aegon Team Tennis event, with an 8 & Under team as well as a men's team.*
- *New fencing had been erected, but had suffered from two phases of wind damage, most recently caused by "Doris". Two new nets had been purchased.*
- *On the committee front it was confirmed that Nicole Desbêtes & David Butt were stepping down, and Suzanne Emond was relinquishing secretarial duties (although remaining as membership sec.) in favour of Charlotte Jefferies. Mandy Butt was to oversee mini-tennis bookings. Cecily Massey had joined the committee, and it was confirmed at the AGM that Jacinta Whitfield would also join.*
- *Charlotte had introduced a clubhouse maintenance rota, and Krassimira Jeliazkova-Jones and Sue Bonnington added their name to the schedule of volunteers. Charlotte also talked about the Co-op scheme as described above. Charlotte, with Richard Emond, had plans to carry out horticultural improvements.*
- *The Chair gave an update on floodlighting. One or two neighbours were objecting, but plans were in progress with a pre-application approach to the Council bringing a quite positive officer response. A working party had been set up, an LTA "tennis club activator" would meet us soon, and we would be talking to other local clubs about their experiences. The Chair was also working closely with the IFCA re funding sources. In response to members' questions, it was noted that installation of lights might affect the type of court surface we have. Ideally, we would seek lights for all 3 courts, but at £10,000+ per court we had to see how the finances panned out. The aim was for planning permission to be submitted later this year.*
- *Junior medal winners were Anya Stevart, Cameron Turner-Bowes, Odhrán Whitfield & Hattie Himsworth.*
- *We had a reasonable excess of income over expenditure, but some £3,000+ had been needed for fencing works. Coaching income was up quite a lot, but so was coaching expenditure. Funds in the bank were now in the region of £30,000.*
- *A higher-than-average number of members attended, and many enjoyed the food & drink on offer and the opportunity to socialise.*

April

Results come in for the SFWL. Ingatestone men win Division 6 and are promoted. Having been promoted in the previous season, the women's team struggles a bit this time around and are 6th out of 7 and due to be relegated back whence they came. The mixed team has a good season in their new, higher, division and finish joint 2nd only 2 points behind the league winners. They may just miss out on promotion as the team they are tied with achieved more wins.

Overall (including "unplayed matches") Ingy teams win 17 draw 6 out of 38 matches. More details can be found in the "Records & Statistics" section.

Congratulations to Sue Rogers, her daughter Alison, & Sara Kelly (daughter of Ellen Gormley) for completing the London Marathon on 23rd April and raising many £000s for their charities (Sense & Sarcoma UK).

June

Nick holds a successful junior tournament for under-8s and under-10s on June 17th.

July / August

Nick has a successful time on the British Tennis Tour:
Strathgryffe – he reaches the 5th-8th Playoff Final
Billericay – he loses in the semi-final to the eventual winner
Penarth – he loses in the semi-final to the eventual winner, then wins the 3rd place final

September

IFTC have been shortlisted for a £500 grant from Skipton Building Society under their "Grassroots Giving" scheme. Voting takes place online or in branches throughout September.

October

The "Singles Ladder" is re-launched. 24 players were taking part (as at December 2017).

The Brentwood League results were received. Ingatestone men had a record-breaking season, winning all 14 matches to achieve a club record points total of 100.5 out of a possible maximum of 112. They are promoted to Division 5 for 2018.

22nd October. The 11th annual "Wear it Pink" charity day took place. £105 was raised for the charity in aid of breast cancer research. £1,186 has now been raised since the event started in 2007.

The "Pinkest Person" prize went to "cowgirl" Clare Wheeler. The overall American champion for 2017 was Will Jefferies.

November

Results are received for the summer's Chelmsford league matches.

The men, in their 6-a-side league, finish second in Division 3, just one point behind champions Chelmsfordians II, suffering only one defeat all summer, and were promoted for the second year running.

The women finish a good third, after three years of coming 5th.

The mixed Division 3 was again quite closely contested. Despite the unavailability all season of our four strongest players we finished in a comfortable third position, 8.5 points short of promotion, but 14 clear of relegation. Our points total of 43.5 was our highest for four years.

In the CDLTF seniors' Midweek Daytime League, Ingatestone mixed were affected by the absence of several players, but came a strong third, only three points behind the winners. In fact, going into the last match they still had a chance of claiming the title they won in 2016.

We also entered a women's team in this midweek league, but they finished 7th and bottom, not helped by a spate of injuries, accidents, illness and absences.

7th November: Following a public vote, IFTC have won a £500 grant from Skipton Building Society under their "Grassroots Giving" scheme. The award will be used to provide tennis shirts for our junior players.

With regard to the floodlighting project, following a topographical survey and assessment of lighting spillage by the prospective contractors, a planning application is to be drafted for submission to the local authority.

Phase 1 of moss killing & court washing is carried out by contractors.

December

In an attempt to deal with longstanding drainage problems affecting Court 1 and the entrance path area, it has been agreed that the IFCA will fund the installation of a sump pump. An underground outlet pipe will run to the drain outside the clubhouse WC.

A club night out at Nirvana restaurant on 20th December.

2018

January

Trees alongside the entrance pathway from the car park are cut back in early January. It is hoped that this will help reduce the amount of debris on the courts, dampness and moss growth.

Phase 2 of moss killing & court washing.

February

AGM (7th February)

- *Membership continued to rise, and had now reached 117.*
- *Coaching continued to be popular, especially in the younger age groups. The 11-18 age range was still under-represented. Adult coaching had a new lease of life by the introduction of a new structured and focussed programme. Thanks to coaching assistants Samuel Bromiley (who had departed to Australia) and Will Jefferies who was now preparing for university.*
- *Repairs and maintenance saw less expenditure, at least until late in the year. All the nets have now been replaced; there were some limited fencing repairs, major moss removal and court cleaning plus the need to replace felt roofing to the clubhouse which had been lost in high winds. The trees surrounding the courts have been cut back by the IFCA, who also agreed to pay for the installation of a sump pump which it is hoped will cure the flooding problem. Courts 1 & 2 will need resurfacing in the next 2 or 3 years.*
- *The Chair gave an update on floodlighting. We were now almost ready to submit (through IFCA) a formal application for planning permission to the local authority*
- *The Chair confirmed he is now standing down after around 10 years in the role, but would remain on the Committee for at least one more year to oversee the floodlighting project, act as club rep to the IFCA and to handover financial management to a new Treasurer.*
- *Junior medal winners were Matilda Himsworth, Iona Whitfield, Joseph Taylor-Widgery, Bella Carr.*
- *We again had a reasonable excess of income over expenditure (£2,409). Funds in the bank were now £32,336.*

This year the club aims to enter 10 teams in various summer competitions – probably a record number: a men's team in BDLTA, men's, mixed and women's in CDLTF, mixed and women in CDLTF midweek seniors and 4 teams in the LTA Team Tennis events (under 8, 9, 10 & men). (In fact, by April this had become 8 teams rather than 10, as there were not enough players to sustain a senior women's team, and under ECLTA rules the 10 & unders had to be jettisoned after conceding their first match).

March

A planning application for floodlighting is submitted to Brentwood Council. Their determination is expected by early May.

Drainage works take place, including the installation of a pump, with the hope that these will ameliorate or indeed eliminate the longstanding problems of flooding in the entrance path and Court 1 area.

April

The results are announced for the SFWL. The men's team comes 3rd, in a tight mid-table position, having achieved 4 wins and 2 draws out of twelve matches, plus some average points for a snowed-off match. The mixed team achieves a safe mid-table 4th position, and was not so far off a promotion place once again. The women's team became short of players, so abandoned participation after two matches.

June

3rd June sees a club spring cleaning and grounds maintenance day.

9th June – the club participates in the "Strawberry Fayre" at the local junior school.

13th June – a club social evening at Nirvana, which also celebrated the 10-year tenure of John Galvin as club Chair.

Repairs are carried out to the pathway leading from the car park to the tennis and bowling clubs.

July

7th July – Plumbing works carried out. We now have a new loo, basin & floor, plus a good water supply in the kitchen.

8th July – A successful and well-attended Open Day. Visitors enjoyed coaching, cardio tennis, a BBQ, speed of serve competition, ball machine drills, a raffle and a fun doubles tournament to round off the day.

The fastest servers were: Dave Kinch (88mph) Nick Hilder (87) Shaun McGee (82). On the female front Jacinta clocked up 58, Krassie 51 and Heather 46. The top two youngsters were Hayden (61) and Odhran (55).

17th July – Brentwood Council reject the proposal for floodlighting at the tennis club.

September

4th & 5th September – Repairs are carried out to the rear of the car park.

October

21st Oct – The 12th annual charity Pink tournament took place. The amount raised (£220) broke all previous records by a mile, aided by a generous donation of £50 from Grove TC's match secretary.

The "Pinkest Person" award went to Liz Wyatt. The overall American champion for the summer was Clare Wheeler.

November

The Brentwood League results were received. Our men's team did well in Division V, finishing third, and just squeaked into the promotion zone. League champions were Hutton V, with Writtle II second.

In the Chelmsford Seniors' Daytime Midweek League, Ingatestone achieved a record points total of 35, and are champions, winning the league by 4 points from Forrester Park. It was our second win in this event in the last 3 years.

December

Chelmsford & District LTF summer results are received.

Ingatestone men finish third in a very close Division II, only 5.5 points away from the second promotion slot, and indeed only 7.5 points above the relegation zone. Interestingly, the two promoted teams (Grove II and Chelmsfordians II) were ones whom we beat four times out of four, while the relegated teams (Danbury II and Hamptons I) beat us three times out of three.

Ingatestone women finished in a comfortable mid-table third place in their Div 4, and the mixed team in a similarly secure 4th place in Div 3.

5th December – A Juniors' Xmas meal is held at "The Lounge" in the High Street.

2019

February

AGM (28th February)

- *Membership continued to rise, and had now reached 127 – the highest since 2010 (although some way short of the all-time record of 257 back in 1982). 57% of members are juniors. Subscription fees will rise very slightly this coming year.*
- *Coaching: Following attendance at the "Strawberry Fayre", a coaching link has been set up with Ing Junior School with morning sessions to take place. Junior members attended an Xmas dinner at The Lounge. Mini-tennis saw a rise in Red Ball numbers but a dip in Tots. More older juniors had been attending following the session being broadened to encompass fitness training. The new 5-hour holiday camps with multi-sports had been very successful.*
- *The Open Day in July had enjoyed good weather.*
- *The club again welcomed pupils from the AES from April to July.*
- *The T-shirts had been purchased with the Skipton Building Society grant.*

- *The clubhouse will need substantial repairs in the near future, but we will first await the outcome of the floodlighting appeal – see below. The loo had been replaced last summer. The IFCA had repaired the concrete path and installed the drainage pump. The pump had been a considerable success with no flooding experienced since.*
- *Update on floodlighting: Despite the Council officials recommending approval, the Planning Committee rejected the application in July. The IFCA and the IFTC Committee felt that they had disregarded their officers' advice and misrepresented the application. An appeal was made to the planning Inspectorate in December 2018.*
- *Mandy Butt is stepping down, after many years on the Committee.*
- *Junior medal winners were Hetti Snell, Daisy George, Rosie George, Evan Bonnington.*
- *The Treasurer reported a strong financial year with a surplus of £2,618 (compared to £2,409 in the previous year). Income was £23,231, mainly from coaching & membership subscriptions; Expenditure was £20,613, with increased spending on coaching, repairs & maintenance and one-off professional fees associated with the floodlighting project. Funds in the bank were now £34,954. £3,600 was moved from our current account to a higher-interest savings account.*

April

The results come in for the SFWL 18/19.

Ingatestone men only win one match, but manage to avoid relegation, to retain their place in Division 4. The mixed team finish in a solid 4th position, having won 6 matches, drawn 2 and lost 4.

The summer leagues commence, with men, women, mixed and senior teams participating in the Chelmsford (CDLTF) leagues. For this season our men's team has withdrawn from the Brentwood (BDLTA) league, due to there being a few key absences from the squad, plus the lack of a captain.

May

On 12th May we hold a successful "Adults & Kids" mini-tennis event. The winning pair were Suzanne Emond & Odhrán Whitfield.

17th May - Last year the IFCA applied on our behalf for planning permission to install floodlighting on the courts. Last July Brentwood Council refused to grant permission on the grounds of the adverse impact that would result to local residents. The IFCA exercised its right to appeal to the Planning Inspectorate against the Council's refusal based on the fact that Council officials had recommended that permission be granted subject to certain conditions (which we had accepted) and because of the many inaccurate statements made by Councillors at the planning decision hearing. The IFCA has now been notified by the Planning Inspectorate that the appeal has been rejected, again on the grounds of the detriment to the nearest residents. We and the IFCA accept this decision and have no further plans in respect of floodlighting for the foreseeable future. We will examine the options for alternative improvements to the facilities at the Club, such as a new Clubhouse and/or resurfacing the courts.

19th May – Club members Neil Bromiley & John Bright win the LTA Grade 3 40 & over doubles event at Grove LTC in Chelmsford, losing only 5 games in total at the semi-final and final stages.

June

Repairs are carried out to the higher fencing to the rear of Court 3.

8th June – We hold a very special exhibition day, featuring top GB professional Marcus Willis (who memorably played Roger Federer at Wimbledon in 2016). The day included coaching for the junior performance squad, a "Q&A" session, ball signing, an exhibition set of singles v IFTC's own Nick Hilder, doubles masterclasses, BBQ, raffle and a spot-the-ball competition. Photos of the day can be found in the club website gallery. Marcus hopes to return to us in 2020.

July

Several club members participated in the Essex Open at Billericay Tennis Club. Daisy Edwards won the 10 & under singles and doubles, and reached the final of the 12 & under doubles. John Bright won the 50 & over singles. Nick Hilder reached the QF of the Open Singles and the SF of the doubles. Frankie Edwards came 3rd in the 8 & under event. Reggie Edwards reached the last 16 of the 12 & under singles & the final of the doubles. Thomas Taylor-Widgery took part in the 10 & under singles and doubles.

September

The annual club championships took place on 7th & 8th September.

October

Chelmsford League results are received for summer 2019.

It was our most successful season ever, with 70% of matches won – 28 out of 40.

The men's team came 2nd in the very tough Division 2 and thus qualify for promotion to the even stronger Division 1 in 2020 – the first time ever that an Ingatestone team have reached the top division.

The women won 8 matches out of 12 in a strong season, but missed out on the 2nd promotion position by three and a half points.

Our mixed team narrowly claimed 2nd place and are eligible for promotion to Division 2, where they feature for the first time in a decade.

December

Moss treatment and court cleaning works are completed on 6th December.

8th December - The tennis club offers free mini-tennis coaching as part of the IFCA & Rotary Club Xmas Market.

2020

February

Strong winds damage court fencing. Emergency repairs carried out.

March

The worldwide coronavirus epidemic affects many tennis activities (and much else). Group coaching, the AGM, Quiz Night, the first American tournament and all summer league matches are cancelled. The IFCA Community Centre closes its doors for now.

The SFWL for 2019/20 is called to a halt, with unplayed matches being subject to an average points calculation. Ingatestone men finish bottom of Division 4; our mixed team are 5th in Division 4, in lower mid-table.

June

Restricted social play and coaching resumes, with a court booking system and social distancing and other procedures in operation.

July

Works are carried out to lay paving slabs in the area to the front of the clubhouse, realign the pathway and carry out some returfing, to try and alleviate the muddiness that occurs in wet weather. Many thanks to the manual labourers – Richard Emond, Neil Bromiley, Jasper Jefferies & Will Jefferies.

October

Head Coach Nick Hilder announces his departure from the club after 5 years of much achievement.

The 14th annual “pink” American tournament took place on 11th October – the only American we were able to hold in 2020. An excellent attendance with 27 players plus spectators. It was good to have some participants from other local clubs (Mountnessing & Hamptons). The money raised was our highest total ever at £300. Charlotte Jefferies was the pinkest person. The sweepstake games were won by Emma Jefferson and Kathryn Field. The winner of most games on the day was Eva Delgado-Pelarda.

December

Tennis suffers a nationwide lockdown once again.

2021

March

Tennis courts are due to reopen on 29th March. Easter coaching camps are planned, plus a resumption of other coaching and mini-tennis.

League tennis is to resume, in a somewhat truncated format, later in the year.

The club has acquired some temporary portable rechargeable lighting to facilitate coaching and play in afternoons & evenings at darker times of the year. (No planning permission is required for these).

April

Courts 1 & 2 are resurfaced with a type of artificial grass called “Tiger Turf”. Court 3 has weed and moss treatment.

Club member Kathryn Field generously donates a Tennis Rebounder practice frame to the club.

May

An American tournament is arranged for 2nd May to “open” the new courts.

July

Court 3 has a respray, and now displays green and purple colours.

September

The annual club championships took place on 11th and 12th September.

October

The 15th annual “Pink” charity tournament took place on a mild and quite sunny afternoon.

Money raised £240.

The overall American champion for the year was Clifford Gbeckor-Kove.

2021 was our 13th season in the Chelmsford League.

The men found themselves in Division 1 for the first time ever. The standard of the opponents was very high, but some sets were won for us by the father & son combination of James & Reggie Edwards. Only 6 matches were scheduled. We almost certainly finished bottom of the league, but the final league tables have yet to appear. In any event, there was to be no promotion or relegation in 2021.

The women in Division 4, captained by Nicole Desbêtes, had 5 matches to play and won 2, drew 1 and lost 2. Again, no final league tables have materialised and there was no promotion or relegation at stake.

The mixed team in Division 3 of 4, under Gráinne Stephenson, only played 3 matches, the other 2 being cancelled by their opponents. They won 1 and lost 2.

The women's and mixed teams are continuing in the CDLTF in 2022. The men have elected to return to the other local league (Brentwood & District), where they previously participated from 2002 to 2018.

In the daytime midweek Chelmsford Seniors' League, it was our sixth season. We had won it 3 times previously but this time we finished second, some way behind the champions Forrester Park.

2022

April

Most membership fees are staying at the same or close to last year's basic rates, although there is to be no early bird / covid reduction this year.

A members' survey has taken place to help the club plan its future. 24 members respond.

A spruce-up day is planned for 24 April.

The AGM is set for 10 May, and will include a demonstration of the recently-installed defibrillator.

This year is our 50th anniversary on this site (and the club itself will be 130 years old), so we're planning a special event on 22 May.

An updated coaching chart of coaching activities has been prepared and disseminated to members.

The results came in for the SFWL season 2021/22.

Our men's team, playing in Division 6, did quite well, winning 7 of their 14 matches and being close to the promotion zone until the last few weeks of the season. In the end they finished in 4th place behind Bentley II, Ongar and Chelmsfordians III. They were unbeaten at home until the last match of the season (although that was actually a home match played away, so we could claim we were invincible on "home soil"). 44 sets were won at home and only 12 lost.

The mixed team won 3 and drew 2 of their 14 matches, and finished in 6th place above Writtle II and Hutton IV, and escaped relegation.

May

AGM (10th May)

- *Members were welcomed back to our first in-person AGM since 2019, due to the covid lockdown of 2020 and early 2021.*
- *The AGM report described the improvements to the club – the 2 new court surfaces 1&2, and the repainting of Court 3; the defibrillator; the 10 new portable floodlights; the new paving; the rebounder; the horticultural works by Neil Bromiley. Future projects include potentially a new clubhouse, subject to fundraising.*
- *The 2020 quiz night had had to be cancelled, but we recently held a successful wine-tasting evening. Our partnership with the Co-op continues, and there were still some cards available for members.*
- *Membership fluctuated during the pandemic – 127 in 2019, 82 in 2020, then back to 131 in 2021/22, but junior numbers were now low. Most fees stayed the same this year, but without an early bird concession.*
- *Josh Ratnage had replaced Nick Hilder as Head Coach.*

- *Charlotte Jefferies, Grainne Stephenson, Jacinta Whitfield and Phil Lloyd were stepping down from the committee, to be replaced by Jessica Bonnett, Neil Bromiley, Steve Jarrett and Adrian Bonnett.*
- *The Treasurer presented the accounts, which were approved, subject to independent audit to come. Despite the major capital expenditure in 2021, the club remains in a healthy financial position with £6,607 in the current account and £18,680.90 in the savings account.*
- *Suzanne Emond gave a demonstration of the defibrillator.*

May 22nd – We held a very successful anniversary / open day, marking 50 years in our current location (and 130 years as a club). A junior mini-tennis event was held, and junior medals were presented to the 4 best achievers in the last year (Keanna Fernando, Isla Hindle, Taylor Jarrett & Georgiana Major). A round-robin “American style” event took place throughout the afternoon, and a speed of service contest. The fastest legitimate serves were Josh Ratnage with 94 mph, Todd Ratnage 90mph, Adrian Bonnett 81mph, Chris Hindle 73mph.

2023

January

The remaining results for the 2022 summer leagues are published.

A most successful season for IFTC - we played 33 matches, winning 26 drawing 3 and losing just 4.

The men, on their return to the Brentwood & District League won 9 matches out of 10, and *appeared* to have won Division 6 just pipping their close rivals Bentley II. However, 6 months after the season's end, and some 4 months after the deadline to submit results, Bentley claimed that one of their results was missing and this was accepted by the League Secretary and a majority at the AGM, meaning that they ended up with 2 points more than Ingatestone. Both teams were promoted.

In the CDLTF, our women won 7 drew 1 lost 1, to win Division 4 by 5 points and gain promotion. Our mixed team won 5 drew 2 and lost 1 to top Division 3 by 4.5 points. Both sides are eligible for promotion to the next division up.

March

The AGM took place on 1st March.

- *The Club Secretary welcomed members, and reviewed the last year, mentioning the anniversary event in May 2022, the 16% drop in membership to 110 members, the change to an online membership application process and the successful amalgamation of adult tennis club membership with the Community Association fee.*
- *Some new coaching sessions had been added in the year, and the coaching team expanded to include Janine Brecknell's sessions and assistance from Emily Sutton. Online booking for coaching was working well.*
- *Three sponsors' boards are now in use, from which we receive £1,500 a year.*
- *Future plans include new fencing, an LED floodlight system called "Tweener" and a new clubhouse.*
- *The Treasurer's report advised of a healthy balance of £31,643.*
- *The Match Secretary reviewed league results and club tournaments.*
- *Suzanne Emond, who is retiring from the committee after 20+ years, was thanked for all her work.*
- *Some very minor changes to the club constitution were approved.*

April

Double success in the Winter League (SFWL). Our men top Division 6, winning 12 matches out of 14, and are promoted. Our mixed team win 8 matches out of 12 in Division 4 and are champions.

May

The summer leagues start, with our three promoted teams in action. But initial results are not promising – the standard of opponents being more testing than last summer.

Our Head Coach Josh Ratnage, who has been with us since 2019, has moved on to pastures new with our best wishes. We welcome a new, experienced, Head Coach - Andy Dowsett. Andy will be assisted at specific sessions by Adam Jessett. Janine Brecknell continues her popular midweek group sessions.

August

On 6th August we had a successful first-ever yoga session, organized by member Nicky Harper.

Fees for guests to be changed for the first time since 2007. Will now be £6 per visit rather than £3, but with up to 10 visits allowed to any adult member's guest in any year.

There is to be a small change to the fee structure for public "pay & play" usage of Court 3.

The committee revisited the question of whether to levy match fees on league match players, but decided to retain the current policy of no fees.

In the summer league, the men's team are doing very well after a slow start, and have now won 8 and drawn 1 of 11 matches played so far. The mixed team are faring less well, with only one win, and may face relegation. The women's team are holding their own in a closely-contested division. The seniors' team are doing well with 4 comprehensive wins and one defeat.

Winter league fixtures for the 23/24 have been arranged. Most away matches are in the pre-Xmas period, with home fixtures in January – March. Winter women's captain to be Teresa Ravenscroft. Mixed captain to be Andy Luxford.

It is agreed to introduce a second men's team into the summer leagues for 2024. The current team to continue in the Brentwood League. A new team to be introduced into the lowest division of the Chelmsford League. A captain to be sought.

Works for new fencing and LED "tweener" floodlighting system due to commence in late September / early October. In the meantime, minor repairs are being carried out to two of the ten portable floodlights.

A "Golf Day" is planned for 9th September.

The annual "pink" charity American Tournament is set to start at 10am rather than the usual 12 noon. Morning events have proved to be popular this year.

An attempt is being made to fill the vacant post of Club Chair.

September

2024

February

The death was announced of club legend Deirdre Kemble – a club champion in the 1980s and 1990s at least 6 and 10 times respectively in singles and doubles.

March

The AGM took place on 19th March.

- *The Club Secretary welcomed members, and reviewed the last year. Membership had risen to 125 (88 adults and 37 juniors) – helped by the active promotion of the half-year and quarter-year reduced rates and the effect of the new Head Coach in encouraging new members. Membership fees to rise by approximately 10% for 24/25.*

- *The amalgamation of adult tennis club membership with the Community Association fee had been a success.*
- *Kelly Mitchell had done good work developing our presence on Instagram, Facebook and other media, and producing regular newsletters.*

- *Potential future plans included the refurbishment of Court 3 and the renovation or replacement of the clubhouse.*
- *Peter Spencer is to become club secretary and Jessica Bonnett club chair. The remainder of the committee is Adrian Bonnett (Treasurer), Chris Hindle, Neil Bromiley, Cecily Massey (Membership Secretary), John Bright, Steve Jarrett, Kelly Mitchell (full details on website).*
- *Some very minor changes to the club constitution were approved – relating to visitors' fees. Visitors to now be allowed to have up to 10 visits a year.*

April

A very thorough spring-cleaning weekend at the club on 6th & 7th April.

In the Winter League 2023/24, Ingatestone men have a very good season in Division 5, winning 11 matches out of 14 (75 sets out of 112), but frustratingly look like missing out on promotion by just one point. The women came second in Division 5 and comfortably won promotion. The mixed team go back down to Division 4 after only winning one match.
