GOVERNANCE

This year, we've been working on changing the club from an Unincorporated Association into a Company Limited by Guarantee.

This year, we have been working with Solicitors Harrison Clarke Rickerby's and have:

- Registered a Company Limited by Guarantee with Companies House
- Created and consulted on new Articles to govern the club
- Created a Business Transfer Agreement to transfer the assets of the club to the new legal entity
- Renegotiated the lease with the Parish Council
- Set up a business bank account for the new entity

We'll be in a position to complete the transfer on the 1st of April 2024 so that when you all renew your membership, you join the new entity.

Membership Report

Previous 2 and 3 year membership offers drew to a close at the end of the 2022/23 season in preparation for the club's move to a Company Limited by Guarantee.

The adult membership category remains buoyant, with new members coming via pay and play or the 1 month for £1 trial membership channels. Junior membership numbers remain a focus area for the club as does the recruitment of a new membership secretary.

FINANCE

The accounts for the year show closing total funds of £9,493 at 30th September 2023 and a profit for the year of £719.

Key points

Revenue

Membership revenue

Like for like membership revenue is consistent with prior years. FY22 was the last year of the 3 year membership deal offered in FY20 and the 2 year membership deal offered in FY21.

Pay and play / visitors fees

This includes pay and play fees.

Social functions and Fundraising

The raffle at the Christmas party as well as the BBQ on finals day contributed to KLTC funds.

Match fees and Tennis Balls

In year profit of £26. An estimated stock value of £117 was carried into this financial year. At 30 September 2023 the estimated stock value was a similar level. Due to the quantity of balls the club ordered in year to March 2023 we are also expecting an allocation of free balls from the sponsor, Head, value circa £80. Summer match fees value £450 were due 20 Sep 23, these have now been received.

Floodlight monies received

Since installation of the floodlights revenue has exceeded charges by in excess of £4,300; this covers maintenance required, replacement bulbs and contributes to the sinking fund for court upgrades.

Other Income

Received from Worcester Tennis Academy, Non member fees (£248), Kings school camp (£55), Tournament (£21). FY22 included £405 of revenue from Kings school in relation to the Summer 21 holiday camp. Costs associated with this camp were settled in FY21. (£338, Miscellaneous)

Expenditure

Maintenance

This includes grass cutting as well as general maintenance to the courts and fencing.

Medals and Trophies

Additional trophies and medals were purchased and awarded in FY23.

Loans

In 2022 the KLTC secured an interest free loan from the LTA, value £8,000, to fund the re-surfacing of courts 1 & 2. This is repayable over 3 years. As at 30 September 2023 £4,000 is outstanding.

Court 1 & 2 re-surface

Work to re-surface courts 1 & 2 was completed in 2022. The retention fee was paid in FY23 £979.00.

Other expenditure

Slight increase in LTA affiliation fees.

No fees payable to KSA year to March 23; no use of pavilion.

KPC rent (£10) for FY23 due for payment.

One off solicitors fees in year to transfer the club to legal entity status.

COACHING

The term time coaching programme offers training sessions for players of all ages and skill levels. Junior sessions are held twice a week, catering for all ages from 4 - 16 year olds, sessions occur on Monday evenings and Saturday mornings. During the last half term, these sessions witnessed good attendance, with 24 players regularly attending the Monday evening sessions and 26 different players showing up on Saturday mornings during the spring and summer months. As Saturday mornings are pay-as-you-go sessions, the numbers vary each week. With the onset of winter, we typically expect a 10-20 percent reduction in attendance until spring next year.

Currently, two adult sessions are available: Monday evenings for beginners and social players, and Wednesday evenings for men's team players. Monday evenings is proving popular with a core group of 8 players attending and a few extra players dropping for a bit of extra practice.

James Attwood continues to do a great job delivering the junior sessions and also a good number of individual lessons to club members.

Our main aim for the juniors this year has been to retain more players in the 11-16 year old age group. We identified competition as a key target to keeping them playing tennis and eventually gain enough experience to start attending adult social and team tennis sessions. We set up the Worcester Team Up Series with the other clubs around Worcester (Worcester, Hallow, Ombersley and Boughton tennis clubs) to create competitive opportunities in a relaxed environment so these players can gain some match play experience. All 5 venues have hosted an event with between 25 and 35 players attending each one. Kempsey hosted the September round with a team of 7 from Kempsey taking part. I will be meeting with the coaches from the other clubs at in December to look at how we can continue to develop the series going into next year.

WTA have also started a series of events just for players from the Academy venues. We are looking to rotate to the events around the clubs so not to take up too much court time. Kempsey are hosting a mini tennis event on Saturday 11th November and we will also have a doubles event for players aged 11-16 in early December.

We have continued to develop club school links through delivering free taster days at Kempsey Primary School and Nunnery Wood Primary School. These were delivered as taster days where every pupil in the school was involved in a session and were invited to a taster session at the club. We have already been in contact with both schools plus Cherry Orchard about 2024 and the prospect of after school programmes to grow the school programme even further.
