



Kilsby Tennis Club Rules

September 2020

The tennis courts shall be available for play each day of the week subject to the conditions below. However, court priority is given to club team matches, the schedule of which is on the club notice board and is identified on the online booking system.

Courts MUST be booked via the online booking system through <https://clubspark.lta.org.uk/kilsbytenniscub> Court 1 is next to the A5, Court 2 is next to Hall Close. Members with court bookings will take precedence over those using the court without a booking. The maximum time a court may be booked is 2 hours. Courts no longer needed must be cancelled.

The courts shall be locked at all times when not in use. The last person using the courts is responsible for releasing the tension of the net and locking the gate.

Before playing, members are requested to clear the courts of any loose leaves using the drag net and/or brushes provided. Collected leaves should be deposited in the bin near to the courts.

The gate to the courts is secured with a combination lock. The code number will be given to all members on payment of the annual subscription.

There shall be no other games than tennis played on the courts.

Tennis shoes must be worn on the courts at all times. Shoes with soles that may mark the court surface are not allowed on the court at any time.

The club is under no obligation to provide tennis balls except on club nights and for team matches.

Tuesday evenings are reserved for adult club night. Junior members may play by agreement. Courts are available to adult and junior members at all other times except when club tournaments, matches, league matches or pre-arranged tournaments are being played. Club nights should, wherever possible, follow a seven game mixed doubles format. If people are waiting to play, the 'no-deuce' system should be applied

Guests are welcome but must be accompanied by a member and pay a fee of £3 for adults and 50p for juniors payable to the Treasurer (See a/c details on our website). Members are held responsible for the behaviour of their guest(s) and for the collection and payment of the fee. Visitors may only play tennis on six occasions during the year.

Any person infringing these rules or misusing the facilities provided may be banned from playing on the courts by decision of the committee.
