Diversity and Inclusion Policy Summary Statement including Concern Reporting Procedure

We at Littleton Tennis Club believe that tennis is diverse and inclusive and our overall aim is to ensure that Diversity and Inclusion are embedded in our club's culture and behaviours.

- We respect the rights, dignity and worth of every person within the context of our sport and we prioritise the well-being of children and adults at all times.
- We ask everyone to become a Safe and Inclusive Tennis Champion proactively promoting Safe and Inclusive tennis and taking action against all forms of discrimination.
- Doing nothing is NOT an option: we ask all at the club to report any concerns and disclosures as soon as possible, following the Concern Reporting Procedure. If someone is in immediate danger, call the police (999). Our policies protect any whistleblower or person reporting a concern.
- The Reporting Concern Procedure is similar to the Reporting a Safeguarding Concern procedure and is available to anyone who has concerns about discrimination and/or safeguarding. (Diagram overleaf)
- As a club we contribute actively to enable more people to play tennis more often in a manner that is safe, inclusive and fair. This applies regardless of a person's age, disability, gender, gender reassignment status, marital or civil partnership status, pregnancy or maternity, race, sexual orientation, religion, socio-economic status or any other background.
- We take a proactive approach using positive action to ensure that communities and individuals are valued and able to achieve their full potential.
- We strive to minimise risk and aim to deliver a positive and enjoyable tennis experience for everyone.


Safeguarding or Discrimination Concern Reporting Procedure

If you have concerns that you or anyone else has been or is being discriminated against or has been a victim of discriminatory language or behaviour, or you have concerns about a safeguarding issue then please **Respond**, **Refer**, **Record**.

Respond Listen carefully and calmly to what the person is telling you. Do not interrupt; avoid questioning where possible and never ask leading questions. Reassure the individual that he or she has done the right thing and what they have told you is very important. Do not promise to keep the information secret, but let the individual know that you will need to speak to the club's Welfare Officer or the LTA Safeguarding Team because it is in their best interest. If you intend to speak to the police or social care, you should let the person know that, too. Do not let doubt or personal bias prevent you from reporting any allegation.
