

## TENNIS PLAYER COLLAPSES

Miss Beattie James, the sportswoman and former hockey international, collapsed while playing in Neath Borough tennis tournament at the Dyfed-road sports centre last evening. She was taken, unconscious, to Neath General Hospital and her condition to-day was unchanged.

Miss James won the ladies' singles championship last year and was one of the successful pair in the ladies' doubles. She played and won in one eliminating match in the ladies' doubles last evening and was playing in a second match when she suddenly walked off the court and collapsed beside it. Dr. Andrew Phillips was called. Miss James is a member of the tournament committee.
