Reducing Unused Floodlight Time

In the last Newsletter, we asked that members should cancel their bookings if they were not to be used, to free up time for others to use and to save on floodlighting for evening bookings. The 'Finish Booking' feature on the Clubspark Booker App is now live, which means that it is very easy for you to turn off the floodlights if you finish your game or session early. Simply:

- 1. Open the Booker App (free to download to your phone)
- 2. Select your 'In Progress' booking
- 3. Select 'Finish Booking

Any available booking slots will be freed up and the floodlights will switch off within 5 minutes. (This feature is also available via the web browser).

Booking Courts on behalf of Junior Members

Parents/guardians making bookings on behalf of their children should do so via the website, not using the Booker App. The parent/guardian first needs to sign in using their own LTA login (this is free and easy to obtain). Once logged in, they need to click on their own name in the top right-hand corner and select the junior that they are booking on behalf of. On the next screen, choose the 'book a court' option and follow the options for date, time and duration.
