NEW LIGHTS! NEW FENCE!

The courts are now open again! Social and Vets Sessions are back on, coaching is resuming at Newport Pagnell and you can book courts.

The new fencing is such a great improvement; it looks better and straighter and is more robust. There is some snagging, especially to get rid of a few sharp edges here and there, which will be done on Saturday 4th December. Until then, please take care when playing. Avoid running into the fence!

The lights are partially done. You will be amazed at how good the lighting is on Courts 2 and 3. Courts 1 and 4 require some additional light fittings but even so, the quality of the light on these two courts is a huge improvement. It means we now have 4 rather than 3 courts available in the evenings. The remaining fittings will arrive in January. They will be fitted as soon as possible and the old lighting columns will be taken down.

The gate-access system will be operational in the next few weeks. Until then court access is still with the old padlock and code. As a temporary measure, the floodlights operate with a simple on/off switch under the old controls. As soon as the new controls are in place, more information will be sent out to you all, so please watch out for the email.
