CHAIRMAN'S REPORT 2019

2019 was a year of consolidation in the Association's working relationships with the LTA under the governing body's Participation and Performance Strategies launched in 2018.

On the Participation front, members of Council worked closely with colleagues in the LTA North Region through our Tennis Participation Committee to support clubs across the County and in November 2019 delivered two Club Forums which were well attended by our registered venues.

Safeguarding was a major theme of the year, culminating in a Safeguarding Forum held in September 2019 attended by Club Safeguarding Officers, Club Committee members and Coaches at which a keynote address was delivered by an external speaker and an update on safeguarding issues was given by the Safeguarding Manager of the LTA North Region. During the year, the LTA commenced a programme of safeguarding inspection visits to all registered venues across the UK, spread over a three - year period. A third of our clubs were visited by the LTA North Region's Safeguarding Manager and I am pleased to report that all of our clubs visited so far were considered to be compliant with the LTA's safeguarding standards.

The year also saw the development and launch of a new County website which can be found at clubspark.lta.org.uk/Northumberland. The previous website, which had been maintained by the LTA, had been become significantly out of date and was no longer being supported by the LTA. We are particularly grateful to David Simpson, a member of Council, who has developed the new website based on the Clubspark platform and I would encourage clubs to use the website to promote their events, activities and news stories by forwarding information to communications@northumberlandtennis.org.uk

The Northumberland Tennis Academy continued to provide a comprehensive coaching programme for our most promising performance players and delivered a County Training programme in line with agreements reached with the LTA in 2018. The Annual Reports contain a more detailed report from Chris Sanderson on our performance players and on the Academy's activities during the year.

Our main tournaments – Sport Newcastle/ South Northumberland, Northumberland Open and County Closed – were again held during the summer months with a particularly strong entry for the Northumberland Open. My thanks to the Tournament Committees, Referees and officials who supported these events and to Sarah Oswald who delivered a very successful Northumberland Open in early August. The Open also hosted the 2019 Northumberland Tennis Awards and details of all the Award winners are listed later in the Annual Reports.

The Annual Reports detail results from our junior, senior and veterans county teams during the year. I would particularly single out the Ladies Over 70s who crowned a very successful year by becoming national champions, and our Ladies and Mens senior teams who both gained promotion at Winter County Cup, with the Ladies returning to Group 1 for 2020.

The Northumberland & Durham Inter Club League continued to provide competitive opportunities for junior, adult and veterans teams from clubs based in the two counties, and our own Competitions Committee met early in the season to look at developing more competition within the County.

The Northumberland Club had a successful year and I am pleased to report that a new and updated Operating Agreement was signed on behalf of the Association and the Club in February 2019 which sets out the roles and responsibilities of both County and Club in relation to the day to day running of the Northumberland County Tennis Ground. My thanks to Frank Matthewson, a member of the Club's Executive Committee, who provided valuable legal input into the completion of this new Agreement. A Joint Liaison Committee comprising two representatives each from Council and the Club Executive Committee met regularly during the year to discuss issues of mutual interest regarding the operation of the Club and the running of the grounds.

In August 2019, the Northumberland Club hosted the tennis and squash events held as part of the 2019 World Transplant Games. This was a major logistical event involving all the Club staff, some 80 volunteers and the organisation of many additional resources into the Club to deliver what proved to be an outstanding event. Our congratulations to all those involved in the Club who contributed to the success of the two days of competition.

I would like to thank all the members of Council for their support and contributions during the year and, in particular, the members of our own Executive Committee, Tom Kinloch, Martin Clark and George Murphy who shoulder the greatest load in keeping the Association's affairs on track. My thanks also to Chris Sanderson and the coaches who strive to maintain the Academy as the foremost venue for junior performance players in the north east and to Kim Sanderson who has combined her roles as Academy Administrator, County Administrator and Schools Co-Ordinator so effectively.

The last 12 months has seen the Northumberland Tennis Academy continue in its multiple roles as a County Training venue, an LTA Local Player Development Centre (LPDC) and an established performance academy. County Training has been delivered in all age groups from U8 to U18 with pleasing successes in the various age groups. The LPDC programme is focused on the U10 age group and has provided training opportunities for talented players as well as being the only LPDC in Northumberland, Cumbria and Durham & Cleveland. In addition to these programmes, the existing Academy programme (NTA) has continued to deliver a comprehensive schedule of on court training, strength & conditioning and tournament support to approximately 120 players over the year.

In the younger age groups, there has been a significant increase in the commitment to the number of training hours, which has subsequently seen significant improvements in the standard of this age of player. This is an area the Academy will continue to develop to ensure players are on a performance pathway as early as possible with a view to competing at a regional and national level.

Players from the NTA took part in a tri-county training camp involving Cumbria and Durham & Cleveland which was very well received and helped highlight our stronger standard of player in comparison to other centres and counties. Further discussions have taken place to re-introduce junior county friendly matches, which will be a welcome addition to the calendar.

At a grass roots level closer links with the Northumberland Club have been developed allowing movement between the two programmes dependent upon standard and progression but with the ultimate goal of providing the most appropriate training opportunities to all players.

At a competitive level, NTA has once again had significant representation at County, Regional and National events with tournament wins and ranking increases all providing further evidence of the effectiveness of the training NTA offers. Whilst overseas tournament travel has reduced due to cost and other limiting factors there has still been success on the international stage, most notably with Abby Kelliher establishing her U14 Tennis Europe ranking.

Chris Sanderson was selected for and has completed the LTA's Coach Mentoring qualification and has conducted a number of very successful but on-going sessions with Northumberland coaches. The LTA will be expanding this initiative to all coaches regionally and nationally and Chris will be one of 12 coach mentors delivering sessions to raise the quality of delivery in the region.

In summary, 2019 was a year of new challenges and change but also continued success for the Northumberland Tennis Academy.

Men's Teams

Mens Over 70 - Dennis Mitford

The men's over 70(s) have a strong squad of 10 players, who all play team tennis for their own clubs. As this is the oldest men's team, some older players who remain competitive, continue in the squad.

There were only 4 matches in the season and 7 players were called upon to represent their county. We were only able to record one win, home to Gloucester 3-1 rubbers. Against Avon and Somerset the match ended 2-2 rubbers, 5-5 sets and 38-38 games. Avon were ahead in games in the first 2 rubbers so they were awarded the match (very disappointed). In the away match against Wiltshire we were ahead by 1-0 rubbers when Neil Taylor (a first pairing) collapsed with a lower back spasm and the match had to be conceded. In the other away match against Lincolnshire we lost 0-4 rubbers, but again we had a medical issue with one of our players.

In the two away matches we travelled with 4 players, and if anything has been learned from the 2019 season, there is a need to take an additional player.

Mens Over 65 – Tony Pensom

Carried on a cloud of misplaced optimism, the Men's Over 65 squad entered the new season with its traditional energy and enthusiasm greatly outweighing its talent and potential. The first match was an early trial against our regular nemesis, Cumbria and the form book remained inside the window as they ran out winners 5:0. Though a comprehensive defeat, Nick Keeley stepped up to play No.1 singles and came close to taking his game to a Championship tiebreak, losing a tight second set 7:6 against the Cumbria captain. In the doubles, Jon Pope and Jim Anderson were not able to replicate the obdurate display of defence and battling points that is their trademark on the home territory of Beverley Park, picking up just 6 games in their 4 sets. Don Anderson joined Nick in the other doubles and competed well, losing both sets to a single break of serve.

Next was a season-defining match at home to Suffolk, with Robin Robinson making a welcome return to the fray after a year off with injury, joined by John Wiseman to compete in the singles. Both had excellent games, defeating higher-rated opponents with Robin triumphing in a Championship tiebreak. In their first round doubles, Nick and Don narrowly lost a first set tiebreak before falling away in the second set. So, at the halfway stage, a 2:1 lead gave cause for optimism — until the fickleness of fate intervened. In Nick and Don's return doubles, they lost to another Championship tiebreak, and Robin and John lost both sets to a single break of serve. A tight match was lost 3:2 by the narrowest of margins.

Deciding a change of air might benefit, the team then set off on a road trip to the delights of Nottingham and Cambridge, of which the highlight was probably the overnight stay in Peterborough and the visit to its magnificent cathedral and real ale Dutch canal barge. Against Nottinghamshire, Tony Pensom returned to the fold and quickly demonstrated the folly of that decision by losing his singles with distressing ease to an opponent who had the impertinence to return every shot with pace and precision. John Wiseman, on the other hand, had an epic battle in the No.2 singles, triumphing in a Championship tiebreak after playing exceptional tennis. Sadly, the doubles matches were less hotly contested, with Jon Pope and Nick Keeley succumbing in both their matches, as did John and Tony in their doubles. Leaving a 4:1 defeat.

Travelling on to Cambridge, the same players had a much closer battle. Jon and Nick won their first doubles with a rare degree of comfort, while Tony and John struggled in their singles. Roles were reversed in the doubles round, with Tony and John securing their game but Jon and Nick unable to overcome a strong pair, leaving the team to rue an opportunity lost and a 3:2 defeat.

The final match was another lengthy journey to Swindon to play Wiltshire. After another convivial evening among the lofty spires of Lincoln College, Oxford, Nick Keeley and Don Anderson reprised their roles in the singles while Vince Kennedy joined Tony Pensom in the doubles challenge. Nick and Don found it tough against strong opponents, but Tony and Vince came through a rigorous test to win their doubles on a second set tiebreak. So at 2:1 down there was still more than honour to play for. Sadly, fickle fate again showed its face, with both doubles being lost within a minute of each other on a Championship tiebreak — a potential 3:2 victory being snatched away by just a couple of points.

But for the final two points in 3 Championship tiebreaks, a 0:5 season could have been a 2:3 season and left us feeling our efforts and commitment had been fairly rewarded. Nevertheless, we battle on and will look forward to next season with excitement and determination. As ever, it has been a pleasure and a privilege to represent the County and to play with such a fine group of gentlemen – if our sportsmanship and enthusiasm could only be matched by a similar amount of talent, we would be a force to be reckoned with. As it is, my thanks go to all who have played and supported the team – and particularly Nick who was always willing to make himself available when need arose, and played in every match.
