CHAIRMAN'S REPORT 2022

I am pleased to report that 2022 saw a full return to "business as usual" after the interruptions caused by the Covid pandemic in 2020 and 2021.

The year saw a full programme of County Cup competition, our annual County tournaments, an N&D League summer programme and a Winter League programme together with a return to Veteran's competition. Reports on these events are as usual contained within the Annual Report.

The Academy continues to provide a full coaching programme for the County's most promising juniors and my thanks to Chris Sanderson and the team of Academy coaches who strive to ensure that the highest quality is maintained throughout the programme for all age groups. Chris Sanderson's report details the number of players who have competed regularly in LTA Grade 1-3 events and also those who are competing in Tennis Europe and ITF events.

Reports are provided on our County teams and particular mention must be made of our Under 18 girls team which gained promotion and to our outstanding Ladies County Team who came second in Group 1 at County Week in July and followed this up by gaining promotion also to Group 1 for 2023 Winter County Cup.

Much of the year was spent in considering Corporate Governance issues and at the end of the year a new County Funding contract was signed with the LTA under which the County will receive some additional funding over a three-year period. A section of the Annual Report provides more detail on these matters.

Our Tennis Participation Committee continued to meet on a regular basis to discuss a range of topics around facility plans being developed within a number of our clubs, the new LTA Parks investment project, competition issues, safeguarding and workforce development. Leeds Beckett University continued to provide coach education courses to support the LTA's new coach qualification structure.

Regular meetings of our Joint Liaison Committee were held with the Northumberland Club as further developments on the County Ground were planned and delivered during the year. In particular, the former Portland Pavilion (previously used for many years as the Groundsman's Pavilion) was completely refurbished and as we moved into 2023 a licence agreement was entered into by the Club with an operator to provide a bespoke spinning facility on the ground. Further developments on the County Ground are in the pipeline.

We made use of the LTA's awards scheme to support our County awards in 2022 and the Annual Report gives details of our County winners who will be presented with their trophies at the AGM. We would like to see more nominations in 2023 to enable us to return to the "live" Awards evening we had successfully held up until the pandemic shutdowns.

I would, as ever, like to thank all the volunteers and coaches who work hard to provide a positive tennis experience for members within our clubs.

My thanks to members of the NLTA Council for their continued support during the year, and in particular to my Executive Committee colleagues Tom Kinloch, Martin Clark and George Murphy who continue to deal with day-to-day matters in between our regular Council meetings.

My thanks also to Jane Grey who continues to represent Northumberland as our LTA Councillor and who serves on one of the LTA'S national committees. Also, to Sue Oswald who as County Safeguarding Officer provides much commitment and experience towards promoting good safeguarding practice across the County. Finally, my thanks to Kim Sanderson for her support to the NLTA both as County Administrator and Academy Administrator.

Northumberland Tennis Academy - Manager, Chris Sanderson

2022 was a very positive year for the Northumberland Tennis Academy. The Covid-19 pandemic was in the past and NTA saw a return to normality in training and competition, with an increased number of players involved.

The Northumberland Tennis Academy continued in its multiple roles as a County Training venue and an established performance academy. The role of LPDC is no longer supported by the LTA, instead we were listed as one of the 67 U10 Performance Network centres. Whilst no LTA funding is provided for this, they do support coach development in this key age group.

County Training was delivered in all age groups from U8 to U18 and the various County Cup events saw a mixture of successes and excellent efforts from our teams. However, there were difficulties raising enough players in some of the younger age groups, which highlighted the issue of players being nominated by clubs/coaches. Due to the lack of players competing at a young age, NTA made the decision to run monthly mini red/orange/green tournaments, to encourage players from local clubs to get involved. These events have continued throughout the year with very promising numbers and have been very well run and administered by Lauren Jones and her team of assistants.

In the younger age groups within NTA there has been a significant commitment to the number of training hours, which has subsequently seen significant improvements in the standard of this age of player. This is an area the Academy will continue to develop to ensure players are on a performance pathway as early as possible, with a view to competing at a regional and national level.

In addition to County Training the existing Academy programme (NTA) has continued to deliver a comprehensive schedule of on court training, strength & conditioning and tournament support to approximately 120 players over the year.

At a grassroots level, NTA used the LTA's Youth Start initiative to give more children the chance to get involved in tennis. This scheme provides a great opportunity for children to have weekly sessions at an affordable rate and in very well-structured sessions. Simon Telfer and Chris Whittle have been the lead coaches in these sessions and should be recognised for their hard work and professionalism in organising the on court lessons.

At a competitive level NTA has once again had significant representation at County, Regional and National events with tournament wins and ranking increases all providing further evidence of the effectiveness of the training NTA offers. NTA had 18 players competing at LTA grade 1-3 level events along with 5 players competing internationally in both Tennis Europe and ITF events.

In summary, 2022 was a year of increased activity and numbers involved and The Northumberland Tennis Academy will move into the next 12 months with a continued motivation to develop performance tennis players.

LTA REPORT FOR NORTHUMBERLAND 2022

Provided by Nicki Harrison (LTA North Participation Development Partner)

1. PARTICIPATION

a. Clubs

Venue Registration – LTA Minimum Standard now requires coaches at Level 2 or above to be LTA Coach Accredited as well as existing criteria.

There are 27 LTA registered clubs (incl. David Lloyd Newcastle)

b. Parks – Laurie Haines (LTA Parks Investment Development Partner)

In March 2021, Laurie Haines, LTA Participation Development Partner for the North East, and Paul Bennett, Head of Region (North), were seconded to the newly formed LTA Parks Investment Team. Paul Bennett took on the role of Head of Parks Investment Delivery, with Laurie leading on Parks Investment for the North Region.

The Park Investment programme includes a nationwide investment of £21.9m by the UK Government also supported by the LTA Tennis Foundation, delivered by the LTA, to refurbish public tennis courts across Great Britain, and open up the sport to many more people in parks. This investment will see thousands of existing park tennis courts in poor or unplayable condition brought back to life for the benefit of communities across the country through renovation works, and improved court accessibility with new gateaccess technology and booking systems.

Since March 2021, Laurie has been working closely with Local Authorities across the North, to raise awareness of the grant funding opportunity, to ensure Local Authorities' understanding of the funding terms and ongoing commitments, and also to identify a pipeline of projects for potential investment.

Conversations are ongoing with identified Local Authorities including Newcastle and North Tyneside with the aim of developing parks that will be sustainable and protect courts for the benefit of communities long term. The aim overall is to drive participation by upwards of 500k players, enabling a smooth customer journey to book a tennis court or activity and providing opportunities that break down barriers to playing such as weekly organised free tennis activity and recreational competition through Local Tennis Leagues.

c. Community – Rashida Salloo (LTA Community Development Partner)

LTA SERVES

SERVES Venues in the region are managed by the LTA and two other delivery partners which include StreetGames and National Association of Boys and Girls Clubs (NABGC) who have recently partnered with the LTA.

There are currently five active SERVES venues in the region, mainly in Newcastle which include Hat-Tricks who restarted their delivery, Wallsend Boys Club and African

Community Advice North East Centre who are relatively new to the programme. The age range for the SERVES programme has been expanded and now includes young people between 4-18years old.

We are looking to engage more SERVES venues in the region in 2023, a number of venues have already been identified in South Tyneside and Newcastle.

The LTA launched the Breaking Down Barriers plan in Autumn 2022 to extend our reach and support more young people from lower socioeconomic groups to have greater access and involvement in tennis. The plan can be accessed here - <u>Breaking Down</u> Barriers plan

d. Education

LTA Youth Schools Offer – Working through the School Games Organiser network across Northumberland there has been communication to promote the LTA Youth Schools Offer and provide support for the delivering inter-school competition and festivals across the County.

<u>Primary Schools</u> – Training is available for teachers through an online or face to face option. Schools who complete training will be provided with a £250 voucher to redeem against equipment or engaging an LTA Youth trained tennis coach for 10 hours.

<u>Secondary School</u> – Available in 2022 as an online training option and extending to face to face and/or online for 2023. Schools who complete training will be provided with a £250 voucher to redeem against equipment or engaging an LTA Youth trained tennis coach for 10 hours.

Note – the LTA Youth Schools Offer is available to Special Education Needs (SEN) schools.

e. Open Court (Disability) – Matthew Elkington (LTA Disability Development Partner)

<u>Open Court Open Court Tennis Programme (Ita.org.uk)</u> – There are 6 active venues (4 tennis clubs). In post pandemic 2022 there were 88 monthly players recorded. The opportunity for the participation figures to rise in 2023 are high, with additional 'open court' venues to come on board and work with national partners (SENSE, AOC Sport and Parkinsons UK)

Open Your Doors venues receive:

Light Package (12+wks) - £300 grant; Inclusive Adaptive Equipment Pack; OYD ELearning.

Standard Package (36wks) as above plus mentoring, access to national partners

Venues who want to be more inclusive can continue to benefit from attending an 'Open Your Doors Workshop'. The course covers:

- What 'inclusion' and 'accessibility' really means
- The barriers of participation in tennis by disabled people
- How to overcome some of these through positive change
- How LTA can support you both inclusively and through our Open Court Programme

County Governance & Funding Update

Northumberland Lawn Tennis Association have been on a journey alongside and with the LTA and other 38 County and Island Associations over the past 2 years to develop and deliver an engagement plan to enable an even more joined-up approach to growing tennis.

In this time, we have agreed:

- 1. A Governance Framework which we have all signed up to:
 - There are 4 Principles: Purpose, Finance & Risk, People & Inclusion.
 - There are 14 focus areas, in 2022 we needed to be compliant with 65% (9/12) and in 2023 we need to achieve 85% (12/14), 100% compliance will be required by end of 2024.
 - These are linked to the Code for Sports Governance and best practise in the industry.
 - Compliance is a condition of membership to the LTA.
- 2. Outlined the Core role of Counties; so, we are all clear on who does what between the LTA and County Associations.
- 3. Agreed a new Funding Model with the LTA to take effect from 1st Jan 2023:
 - Under this we will receive £65,000 annually for a commitment of 3 years with an annual renewal thereafter.
 - This includes funding for General Participation, including Open Court (Disability), Competition and Performance.
 - We no longer receive the subscriptions clubs pay when they complete the LTA annual venue Registration scheme.
 - We decide who is a member of the County therefore moving forwards.
 - There will be some reporting arrangements on the above.

There are many benefits to this way of working, which include:

- Clarity around roles & responsibilities to support the development and growth of tennis.
- Increased funding support to invest within the County.
- Following best practise in Sports Governance: good governance helps organisations to work more effectively, meet the needs of their people and be sustainable. Benefits include; having robust and reliable systems, processes and policies in place, managing and controlling risks, having open and transparent decision making and reporting processes.

There are some potential risks to this, which include:

 The increased pressure to find new volunteers, as there is a 9-year term limit for Committee Members.

Northumberland Lawn Tennis Association are positive about where we are on the above and will continue to work with the LTA to support tennis growth and development in the County.
