Chairman's Report – Chris Lott

The Association has enjoyed another good year and as the enclosed reports indicate we continue to have much to celebrate both on and off the court.

Our accounts this year show another satisfactory financial performance over the year taking into account the operations of the Academy, the various County teams and the organisation of the tournaments.

I referred in my last Chairman's Report to a further period of change which was underway within the LTA and as 2014 progressed we saw the impact of these changes with the closure of the LTA office in Sunderland, the opening of new LTA offices in Leeds and Bolton to service the north of the country and appointments of staff to posts within a restructured LTA field delivery team and talent performance team. These changes have been communicated to all clubs and a Club Forum was held towards the end of 2014 at which the new structures and roles and responsibilities were presented.

In response to criticisms by Sport England of the levels of tennis participation across the country, which had an adverse impact on the level of financial support provided to the LTA as the governing body, the LTA team have focussed effort and resources in increasing the number of people regularly playing tennis and the frequency of participation. A recent report from Sport England confirmed that these programmes had been successful in raising the level of participation and the funding restriction has been relieved. This has important implications for ourselves and our clubs into the future.

A further Club Forum is to be held at the Northumberland Club on Wednesday 25 March 2015 and I hope all clubs will be able to send a representative to catch up with the latest developments and to engage with other club colleagues and LTA personnel.

Amongst the notable developments within clubs over the last year, Cullercoats TC completed and opened their newly refurbished clubhouse, Bohemians TC completed a court floodlighting project and Corbridge TC who within the space of 2 years from their formation established new floodlight courts and are actively working towards provision of a new clubhouse. We also welcomed Berwick TC as a new registered place to play within the County.

The Northumberland Tennis Academy continues to deliver a high performance coaching programme to the most talented and promising juniors in the County under the leadership of Chris Sanderson. Regular reviews of the Academy's performance as an LTA accredited High Performance Centre are held with the LTA's performance team and the Academy's Report details the achievements of some of our leading juniors. We wish the players continued success in their efforts to achieve national and international success.

On court, we congratulate Emma Wilson who recently was the winner of the National Under 18 Masters Girls event and wish her well on her scholarship place to a US College which she will take up later in 2015. Recognition also for the South North Churchill men's team representing Great Britain in the European Club Championships in La Manga.

A review of the LTA's performance network including the role and funding of High Performance Centres is under way and we await the outcome of this review in order that we can assess any implications for the Academy.

A number of significant national achievements should be highlighted this year:

- The Northumberland Club achieved the prestigious award of Tennis Club of the Year.

- The North East Visually Impaired Tennis Club based at the Northumberland Club was named as club of the year at the North East Disability awards.
- The Northumberland Club has been named as a host venue for the British Transplant Games for those who have had life saving organ transplant surgery and donor families.

The Northumberland Open tournament was once again held during the first week of August and attracted a large entry of players. Once again, the tournament was a great success and my thanks go to the Adderstone Group for their sponsorship of one of the oldest tournaments in the UK's competition calendar. Joy and Tom Kinloch (tournament director and referee respectively) undertook an enormous amount of hard work in order to create such a successful event. One of the highlights of the year is the Northumberland Tennis Awards event held during Tournament week and congratulations go to all the award winners who are listed in this Annual Report.

2014 was the final year of Adderstone's sponsorship of the Open tournament and our thanks are extended to Ian Baggett and Adderstone's for their support to Northumberland tennis over the last 5 years and their continuing support of activities such as the visually impaired tennis programme which the Northumberland Club has taken a leading role in promoting.

In June, Sport Newcastle once again sponsored a junior event and Adderstone's sponsored a separate seniors event. This event was followed by a qualifying round of the Helvetie Cup, an international girl's tournament which took place on the clay courts and was preceded by an opening ceremony involving the display of national flags and the playing of national anthems – a first for the County Ground. I am delighted that there will be a further Helvetie Cup event in 2015.

Progress continues to be made in discussions with the Executive Committee of the Northumberland Club in order to secure a more formalised relationship between the County and the Club. It is anticipated that this will enable improvements to the facilities aimed at preserving the essential character of the County Ground as a venue which provides both facilities for members of the Northumberland Club but also a home for County tennis activities.

Our County teams continue to compete at veteran, senior and junior levels well above expectations and my thanks once again go to all the organisers and team captains who contribute much time and effort in ensuring that we maintain a County presence in inter-county competitions even when it becomes ever more difficult to find willing volunteers and even players.

In particular, we congratulate the Ladies County Team who have secured promotion at four successive summer/winter county cup tournaments over the last two years, an achievement which was recognised at the Annual Awards event in August.

My thanks are again extended to Sue Monaghan who has continued to be involved in administering our Wimbledon Ticket allocation on behalf of the County and has assisted with the move to the new on-line ballot. The on-line Wimbledon ticket ballot system appeared to work well when it was rolled out in 2014 although the recently introduced opt-in arrangements have caused some issues which are being addressed by the LTA.

I would like to thank all the members of Council for their contributions during the year and in particular the members of our own Executive Committee, Tom Kinloch, Martin Clark and George Murphy for their hard work and support during the year. My thanks also to Joy Kinloch who as our County Administrator looks after the County office and dealing with the many aspects of the County's affairs.

I would like to make particular mention of the award to Tom Kinloch of an LTA Meritorious Service Award for his contribution to officiating at national and international level, and of an "unsung hero" award to Martin Clark by Sport Newcastle. Congratulations to both on this well deserved recognition.

Finally, I would like to thank all the volunteers in our clubs and other places to play who continue to work hard to maintain their facilities and provide competitive opportunities to juniors and seniors alike.

Northumberland High Performance Centre – Chris Sanderson, Manager

The last 12 months has been a very successful period for the Northumberland Tennis Academy HPC. This past year has seen further amendments of the HPC Development Plan, building on the previous document and its implementation. Through an ongoing system of monitoring by the LTA we have worked hard to maintain our level 1 status. We have been highlighted as an example of best practice, nationally in various aspects of our programme.

We have continued to focus on players who have the ambition and commitment to play at a National and International level, whilst still helping to support players of a county level. We offer comprehensive individualised training programmes which work on an integrated principle. All of the performance factors are incorporated into these individual programmes with the technical and tactical aspects covered on court in the squad sessions, the mental side is covered by James Newman our Sports Psychologist and the physical aspects are monitored and delivered by Joe Wear our strength and conditioning coach.

The evidence of the quality of our training programme is shown in our spread of Matrix Players throughout all age groups. These are players that fit into the LTA's matrix which recognises, through talent ID and results, the top players in each age group. We have a broad spread of both boys and girls from U10 to U18 and a total of 9 players which places us near the top of the league table for LTA HPCs.

One other very positive addition this year was the expansion of our school outreach programme. Approximately 3500 children have received free coaching with further youngsters benefiting from sessions set up before and after school times. Regular Fundays throughout the year have then provided opportunities for players to join either the Academy or Northumberland Club players.

The on court sessions continue to be delivered by our committed coaching staff who work alongside the strength and conditioning team and our Physio. Their dedication and commitment is the reason for our continued success and also the growth of our reputation nationally. We continue to pride ourselves on our "performance environment" and also our awareness of the standards required for success nationally and internationally.

On the academic side of the HPC the past year has seen us achieve a further 100% completion rate in the AASE course for players looking to gain some of the skills needed to explore a career in the sport in the future. At the other end of the academic spectrum a number of HPC players have moved into higher education through tennis scholarships in both this country and in the States. We wish them all continued success.

The Northumberland HPC is committed to achieving even more success and providing a high quality training environment to even more ambitious players in the coming year.

Tennis Development Manager – Jo Cunliffe

There have been some changes in the structure of the LTA over the past 12 months. I have a new role, 'Regional Tennis Participation Manager.'

We are delighted to have a further 2 roles to help support the development of tennis in the area. The first being the Regional Tennis Competitions Coordinator. Christine Klee was successfully appointed for this

role. The second is Laura Lattimore who is the newly appointed Regional Tennis Education Officer. In addition Graeme Clarkson remains as Facilities Project Manager and we have new regional offices in Leeds and Bolton.

Paul Bennett oversees the operational side of the team in his new role as Head of Region.

We continue to work very closely with the local County Associations and it has been a pleasure working with Northumberland LTA over the last 12 months.
