CHAIRMAN'S REPORT 2019

It has been a busy year for Northumberland tennis in 2018 with some excellent results from individual players and County teams alike, significant anniversaries amongst our clubs, together with investment in new tennis facilities in the County.

Our accounts once again show a satisfactory financial performance over the year taking into account the running of the Academy, our County tournaments and our County teams across all age groups.

Club Forums were held during the year at venues in Newcastle, Hexham and Alnwick attended by volunteers and coaches together with regional representatives from the LTA to catch up on the latest developments in the game and to share examples of best practice both on and off the court.

The annual Northumberland Tennis Awards event was held during the Northumberland Open tournament in August 2018 with players, coaches and volunteers receiving recognition for their achievements and contributions to tennis during the year. Graeme Manwell, Chairman of the North East Visually Impaired Tennis Club received an outstanding achievement award for his work in promoting tennis for the visually impaired across the north east. The Award winners are listed in the Annual Report.

The Northumberland & Durham Inter Club League continued to provide opportunities for junior and adult teams from clubs based in the two counties to compete against each other in various age groups in an extensive league system and to encourage competition amongst players across both regions.

Members of NLTA Council continued to work closely with LTA colleagues through our various sub-committees to promote tennis in the County. Jo Cunliffe's Report detailing the various initiatives is contained within the Annual Report.

The LTA carried out a re-organisation of its Participation Team towards the end of the year and Jo Cunliffe has taken on a new role as Workforce Development Partner across the whole LTA North Region. I would like to place on record my thanks to Jo for her immense contribution in promoting tennis in the County in her previous role as a Regional Participation Manager for many years. We look forward to continue working with Jo her new role and with Laurie Haines who is taking over many of Jo's previous responsibilities in the new LTA team structure as a Regional Participation Partner.

Amongst our Clubs, Beverley Park TC celebrated the completion of a refurbishment of their clubhouse and Cullercoats hosted an extremely successful open day to celebrate their 125th year anniversary. Wylam Tennis Club also successfully completed a refurbishment of their three courts and held an Open Day during the summer to officially open the new courts.

The year saw a major change by the LTA to the venue registration process with all clubs being required to meet minimum standards regarding safeguarding in order to achieve registration for 2018-2019. I am pleased to report that all our clubs met these minimum standards and my thanks to Sue Oswald, the County's Safeguarding Officer, for her commitment and drive in ensuring that we achieved full compliance.

As regards the Northumberland Tennis Academy, the LTA completed the role out of its Performance Strategy during 2018. The Academy submitted an application to the LTA to become a Regional Player Development Centre for players aged 10-14; this application was unsuccessful. A second application to be accredited as a Local Player Development Centre for players aged 7-10 years was, however, successful. The Academy Management Board is in discussion with the LTA as 2019 moves forward regarding the implications of these decisions in relation to the on-going provision of a performance programme for our most promising juniors.

On court, Abby Kelliher, Teddy Prisadnikova and Kuoros Ansarrizadeh continue to receive regional and international recognition for their performances.

The Academy continued its very successful schools outreach programme with a full programme of school visits and breakfast, lunchtime and after school tennis sessions taking place in over a dozen schools in the Newcastle area.

At County level, the annual Sport Newcastle/South Northumberland tournament was held at the County Tennis Ground in June and August saw the staging of the Northumberland Open tournament, one of the largest tournaments of its kind with events for all age groups in both singles and doubles held in the UK. An international event for Girls at Under 16 level was held on the clay courts at the County Ground in July.

The annual Road to Wimbledon tournament took place with Paul Freeman and Louise Smith winning through as the Northumberland County champions.

County teams continued to compete in inter-county national competitions during the year at junior, senior and veterans levels. The County Girls and Boys Under 10 teams competed successfully in their respective age group national finals and the senior County Ladies team competed in the summer County Cup event in the LTA's Group 2 Division and in Group 1 at the winter indoor County Cup event.

The Northumberland Club has continued to progress with membership numbers increasing, roll out of the refurbished Osborne Pavilion as a fully functioning fitness studio, an upgrade to the car park and an upgrade of the floodlighting to three of the outdoor courts at the end of the year. The Executive Committee and the staff of the Club are working hard to provide services and facilities for all Club members and plans for further investment in facilities on the Ground are being developed.

During the year, the NLTA entered into an arrangement with a developer to complete the refurbishment of the entrance pavilion to the car park and the building has now been sub-let to a local nursey group provider who is forging good links between the Northumberland Club and the parents/children who attend the nursery.

I would like to thank all the members of Council for their support and contributions during the year and, in particular, the members of our own Executive Committee, Tom Kinloch, Martin Clark and George Murphy who shoulder the greatest load in keeping the Association's affairs on track. My thanks also to Chris Sanderson and the coaches who strive to maintain the Academy as the foremost venue for junior performance players in the north of England and to Kim Sanderson who combines her roles as Academy Administrator, County Administrator and Schools Co-Ordinator so effectively.

I would like in my Report this year to convey a special thank you on behalf of the NLTA Council to Tom Kinloch who, in December 2018, attended his last meeting as the LTA Councillor for Northumberland. Tom has been indefatigable over the past 19 years in representing the County's interests with the LTA and has worked tirelessly throughout this period to serve tennis in the County at national level. We thank Tom for his contribution and wish Jane Grey, his successor as our LTA Councillor, every success in the future.

Finally, I would like to thank all the volunteers in our clubs and other places to play who continue to work hard to maintain their facilities and provide competitive opportunities for their members.

Northumberland Tennis Academy Manager, Chris Sanderson

The last 12 months has seen the Northumberland Tennis Academy complete its third year as LTA Grant Funded Centre. This was the last year of the three year contract before the introduction of the LTA's new Performance Strategy. Within the new Performance Pathway the Northumberland Tennis Academy applied to be a Regional Player Development Centre and also a Local Player Development Centre. Our application for LPDC was successful and an initially unsuccessful RPDC application has lead to further discussions with the LTA on how we can best continue to be the leading performance venue in the NE.

The new performance strategy also included the introduction of funding for county training. Whilst county training was an existing part of the weekly schedule within NTA the small grant from the LTA has enabled us to subsidise the cost of this training further. There was a very pleasing response from clubs and coaches within the county when asked to nominate players for this programme.

At the grass roots level Kim Sanderson has worked hard to maintain the nationally recognised success of our school outreach programme with over 3000 children being given the opportunity to play the game within curriculum time. Kim has also established a full weekly schedule of early morning, lunchtime and after school clubs, which has raised the participation level within the county massively and provided talent identification opportunities. Many of these children have been directed towards their local clubs to continue their tennis in that environment.

We have continued to focus on players who have the ambition and commitment to play at a national and International level, whilst still helping to support players of a county level. We offer comprehensive individualised training programmes, which work on an integrated principle. All of the performance factors are incorporated into these individual programmes with the technical and tactical aspects covered on court in the squad sessions, the mental side is covered by James Newman our Sports Psychologist and the physical aspects are monitored and delivered by Joe Wear and Blake McManus our strength and conditioning coaches. Our coaching panel meet on a weekly basis to address programme issues but also to expand on and develop aspects of coach education and on court delivery.

Amongst some of the Academy achievements of the last year I would like to highlight Abby Kelliher, Teddy Prisadnikova, Sam Knowles and Harry Cookson competing in national grade 1 events in their respective age groups. We had excellent representation in various age groups in national grade 2 events.

In summary, 2018 was a year of uncertainty, new challenges and change but also continued success for the Northumberland Tennis Academy.
