CHAIRMAN'S REPORT 2016

The Association has much to celebrate both on and off the court as the enclosed reports indicate.

Our accounts this year show another satisfactory financial performance over the year taking into account the operations of the Academy, the various County teams and the organisation of the tournaments.

We have continued to work closely with the LTA North Regional Team in promoting tennis across the County and Jo Cunliffe, in her role as Regional Tennis Participation Manager, reports on the wide scope of her work with clubs, coaches, the local authority sector including promotion of parks tennis, and the education sector.

In December 2015, Corbridge Tennis Club was severely affected by "Storm Desmond"; however, the Club's committee rallied support from members and tennis was soon being played on the Club's courts at Tynedale Park. Working with the LTA and the Club we were able to facilitate an emergency grant from the LTA to assist the club in meeting the cost of repairs in particular to the perimeter netting of the courts.

Liaison has also been maintained with Christine Klee in her role as Competitions Co-Ordinator for the North region and a useful innovation over the last year has been the introduction of Tournament Satisfaction Surveys which have provided useful feedback on our main County tournaments.

A well attended Club Forum was held at the Northumberland Club in October 2015 and another Forum will have been held by the date of our AGM at which the subjects of membership retention and volunteering will have been discussed. I encourage clubs to send a representative to these Forums which provide an opportunity to catch up with the latest developments and to engage with other club colleagues and LTA personnel.

The Northumberland Tennis Academy continues to deliver a high performance coaching programme to the most talented and promising juniors in the County under the leadership of Chris Sanderson and his report details some of the players' successes. We wish the Academy players continued success in their efforts to achieve national and international success.

Last autumn, the LTA completed a review of the High Performance Network and I am pleased to report that the Academy came out highly commended for its work as a High Performance Centre over the previous three years. As a result, the Academy was awarded LTA Grant Funded Status in a new performance network structure although

LTA funding has been reduced in line with a streamlining of all performance funding across the country.

The success of the GB Davis Cup team in lifting the Davis Cup trophy in November is being followed up by the LTA legacy which will see the trophy make an appearance in the county. It is hoped that this success will have a positive effect on the development of tennis within venues and clubs generally.

The Northumberland Open tournament, one of the oldest tournaments in the UK competition calendar, was once again held during the first week of August and attracted a large entry of players. Once again, the tournament was a great success and my thanks go to Joy and Tom Kinloch (tournament director and referee respectively) who undertake an enormous amount of hard work in order to create such a successful event. One of the highlights of the year is the Northumberland Tennis Awards event held during Tournament week and congratulations go to all the award winners who are listed elsewhere in this Annual Report.

In June, the annual Sport Newcastle tournament took place and this was followed by a qualifying round of the Helvetie Cup, an international girl's tournament which took place on the clay courts for the second year running.

The NLTA Council have continued to work with the Northumberland Club to progress discussions which have been on-going in relation to longer term governance arrangements. These discussions continue. Of more practical significance, Council have supported the Club in submitting an application to Badminton England for grant aid support for a project to convert the indoor court of the Northumberland Club into a centre of badminton excellence. The Club have been very successful in raising matched funding and in attracting to the Club a number of badminton clubs previously using other venues within Newcastle.

The Club has undertaken a restructuring of staff roles with new personnel working on functional areas of responsibility in order to grow the Club's membership. Council will continue to work in a positive and constructive manner with the Club committee to ensure the challenges of maintaining such a large and important venue to tennis in the County are met.

A County and Club stalwart over many decades, in the person of Ian Wood, retired from Wood Sports last year and the Club shop is now in the capable hands of Mark McPeake – we wish Mark well in this venture. Ian has played a major role in the life of the Club and the County and we were pleased to be able to mark this contribution by a special presentation to Ian at his retirement event last year. We wish both Ian and Jo a very happy retirement.

Our County teams continue to compete at veteran, senior and junior levels well above expectations and my thanks once again go to all the organisers and team captains who contribute much time and effort in ensuring that we maintain a County presence in inter-

county competitions even when it becomes ever more difficult to find willing volunteers and even players.

In particular, we congratulate the Ladies County Team who again secured promotion at last summer's county week tournament and who will compete in Group 3 in 2016. Having gained promotion to Group 2 of the winter county cup event in November 2014 the team narrowly missed out on a further promotion success in November 2015. The team's achievement was recognised at the Annual Awards event in August by receiving the Adult Team of the Year Award.

My thanks are again extended to Sue Monaghan who continued to be involved last year in administering our Wimbledon Ticket allocation on behalf of the County. The on-line Wimbledon ticket ballot system appears to have worked reasonably well within clubs after it was rolled out in 2014 although the opt-in arrangements have caused some issues which have had to be addressed by the LTA. Sue has now retired as County Wimbledon Ticket organiser and I would like to thank Sue on behalf of the County for all the work she has done in this role over many years.

I would like to thank all the members of Council for their contributions during the year and in particular the members of our own Executive Committee, Tom Kinloch, Martin Clark and George Murphy for their hard work and support during the year.

This year, I particularly want to say a special thank you to Joy Kinloch who retired as the County's Administrator on 31 December 2015 after some 20 years in the role. Joy has looked after the County office and dealt with the many aspects of the County's affairs, in addition to her oversight of the main County tournaments and has seen a great deal of change over the years both within the LTA and the County. We wish Joy all the best for a very happy retirement.

Finally, I would like to thank all the volunteers in our clubs and other places to play who continue to work hard to maintain their facilities and provide competitive opportunities to juniors and seniors alike.

Northumberland Tennis Academy – Chris Sanderson, Manager

The last 12 months has been a period of change for the Northumberland Tennis Academy. There was a fundamental change in the performance network, nationally, which involved a re-application process. The Northumberland Academy was successful in its application to be an LTA Grant Funded Centre and was given a 3-year contract of this status. We have continued to work closely with the LTA to implement a development plan, which is designed to enable us to deliver a programme of the highest quality through regular monitoring and feedback.

Kim Sanderson has worked hard to maintain the nationally recognised success of our school outreach programme with over 3000 children being given the opportunity to play the game within curriculum time. Kim has also established a full weekly schedule of early morning, lunchtime and after school clubs.

We have continued to focus on players who have the ambition and commitment to play at a National and International level, whilst still helping to support players of a county level. We offer comprehensive individualised training programmes, which work on an integrated principle. All of the performance factors are incorporated into these individual programmes with the technical and tactical aspects covered on court in the squad sessions, the mental side is covered by James Newman, our Sports Psychologist and the physical aspects are monitored and delivered by Joe Wear, our strength and conditioning coach.

Amongst some of the Academy achievements of the last year I would like to highlight Will Gray representing Great Britain at U12 level and also making his first steps in competing at U14 European level with some very strong performances. Our U12 boys team became national champions by winning the U12 Aegon Premier League title. We had 7 players competing at the National Championships over various age groups.

In summary the Northumberland Tennis Academy has had to overcome a number of challenges throughout the last year with changes in structure nationally and also with funding but once again it has had a very successful year and continues to evolve and improve.

On the third day, the opposition was Hertfordshire, who had convincingly won on the first two days, so Northumberland knew that it was going to be tough! After the six singles matches, Northumberland were 4-2 down which meant that they had to win all three of the doubles matches. The team played with great skill and determination but, despite winning the first doubles match, they had to accept defeat. Nevertheless, they finished 2nd in the group and so remain in Group 2.

Mens Over 60 – Tony Pensom

We will look back on 2015 as the year of 'what might have been's', with a string of close matches slipping away from the team at the last moment. Early optimism had been stoked by the arrival of Colin Pyle in the squad to form a Dream Team doubles pairing with his fellow Tynedale terrier, David Kendall. The remainder of the squad was made up of bodies from last year's team in the absence of any suitable tennis players.

The first match involved a trip to Bolton to take on Lancashire. With their years of co-habiting the Tynedale doubles court, the Dream Team were pitched into the doubles matches with high hopes they would establish a strong base for a good team result. Their first match brought them within a whisker of victory when, after a brave fightback to win the second set on a tiebreak, they were pipped in the Championship tiebreak 13:11. Sadly the dream then turned into a nightmare as they lost 2:0 in the second rubber. Meanwhile on the singles courts, Don Anderson and Tony Pensom both succumbed 2:0, the latter clawing defeat from the jaws of victory in going from 5:2 up to a 7:5 loss. However, this was partially redeemed in the return doubles when Don and Tony secured an unexpected victory, winning a Championship tiebreak 10:8 for the third set. There was a little late controversy to add to the excitement when the Lancashire Captain discovered he had played his singles players in the wrong order when

completing the results card but, after consulting the Tournament referee, the result was left to stand – 1:4 defeat.

The second match brought Cumbria across to Northumberland. With David Kendall carrying an injury, John Wiseman was resurrected to bring his experience to bear on the squad. John joined up with Don Anderson for the doubles pairing, but sadly they were defeated 2:0 in both. Meanwhile Colin Pyle and Tony Pensom both secured battling victories in the singles matches, Colin winning comfortably 2:0 and Tony taking his after an epic 2½ hour struggle on a Championship tiebreak. However, there was to be heartbreak for them and the team in the return doubles rubber. With the tie at 2:2 and all to play for they took the first set 6:3 but then dropped the second set 6:7 after an epic tiebreak that went to 19:17. It was then all down to the Championship tiebreak with both sides having chances to close the match out (it would be churlish to mention Colin's volley at the net as an example) until Cumbria took it 15:13. Frustration and disappointment all round, mixed with pride at pushing so close to victory – 2:3 defeat.

With the Isle of Man having withdrawn at the start of the season, the final match of the season brought Shropshire to Northumberland. Strengthening the squad immeasurably by dropping himself, David Kendall returned to the squad to replace Tony and compete in the singles with Colin Pyle, with Jon Pope recovering from a long-term injury to re-establish his partnership with John Wiseman in the doubles. David and Colin demonstrated their talent for doubles by losing their respective singles matches 2:0 despite valiant efforts to claw the matches back. Jon and John, meanwhile, showed merciless might in taking their first set 6:0 before showing imperious compassion in ceding the second set 4:6, but they then contrived to win the rubber on the Championship tiebreak. David and Colin were back in their comfort zone in the return doubles, securing a comfortable 2:0 victory leaving it to Jon and John on the adjacent court to battle out the decisive final rubber. In another epic battle the match swung both ways with the home team taking the first set but losing the second. So the match and the season came down to a Championship tiebreak against a hitherto undefeated Shropshire team. All looked set fair as Jon and John swept to a 7:2 lead, but sadly that was to as close as the team got to victory as Shropshire secured the next 8 points to claim victory 10:7 and the match 3:2.

Junior County Cup Reports

JUNIOR COUNTY CUP OVERVIEW

The results were mixed across the age groups. The 14s and 18s teams generally struggled to make an impact, with the exception of the Girls 18s who did well to finish 2nd in Group 4, despite not having GB No. 1 Girl Emma Wilson available for the tie.

In contrast to the results generally for the older age groups, the 9s and 12s showed particular promise. The 9s finished 3rd in a tough group but put in some strong match performances. The Girls 12s progressed to the 1-4th play-offs and only missed out on the final after losing a doubles shoot-out, having drawn the semi-final 4-4.

The undoubted highlight was the 12s boys team, who only missed out on qualification for the London finals by losing on a shootout, having drawn the final 4-4. The results suggest a strong future for boy's tennis in the coming years – and a need to expand the female player base across the age-groups.

U18 Boys
