Secretary's Report

Due to family commitments, this will be my last newsletter for the Club as I shall be stepping down at the AGM in November. For this reason, please forgive me if I take the opportunity to reflect on the last 5 years working on the Committee.

It seems a long time ago now, but when I first came on to the committee the clubhouse had recently burnt down, we were using a mobile home on the carpark for shelter, and membership was extremely low. Mike was our only part-time coach and the LTA had imposed even more criteria on clubs for them to register so that members could play in LTA tournaments. Moral was low and members were worried about the future of the club. But with recently re-surfaced courts, those who were riding the storm with us, were able to continue to play and find some comfort in the friendships formed on court.

What a difference 5 years and a committee pulling together with the support of its members makes.

All pertinent policies and criteria are in place, and we are totally compliant with LTA regulations. Nothing like stating the obvious but...we have a clubhouse to be proud of, an automatic gate system which effectively pays for itself as more fee-paying non-members are able to access the courts, and most recently, new LED lighting, which has come at just the right time in light of the current economic and energy crisis.

For me at the heart of any club is the people who use it. It's they who give the club its identity and who, as at Ombersley, create a warm and friendly environment, which encourages people to join. So much so that I am very pleased to say that we now have over 170 members at the Club. A far cry from the figures back in 2017.

But it isn't just the members that give a warm reception to visitors at the club. We are extremely lucky at Ombersley to have Mike and Andy on the coaching team, who, week by week, month after month, give encouragement to members and non-members alike. On behalf of the club, I thank you both, but on a more personal level, I would like to thank Mike who, over the past 5 years, has never failed to lend an ear and offer support and encouragement during some difficult times. It's been a pleasure to work with you Mike.

And so, looking to the future. Thanks to John's careful management of the Club's finances, the future financial health of the club is assured. We already have plans passed for the building of 2 new courts and will look to create a sound business case to build at least one of these two courts within the next couple of years. If needed I hope to stay involved with this process.

And finally... ODTC is looking for a new Secretary!

I would say that I've thoroughly enjoyed my time working for the Club, and it has been rewarding in so many ways. I have loved meeting so many new people and dealing with so many interesting problems along the way, so much so that I wish I had the energy and time to continue. GATE ACCESS SYSTEM

We are very pleased with the feedback we are getting from members who find it easy to book and access the courts using the keypad.

One of the real bonuses of the system is that it is now no longer necessary for a committee member

to give up their own time to meet non-members to exchange a key so they can use the public court, something we were concerned about in terms of personal safety.

It is now much easier for players to access the courts using the automated system, and there has been an increase in the pay & play income from non-members who are using the courts at quiet periods when members aren't playing. We are hopeful that membership will increase as pay and play tennis players convert to full membership.

Finally, the automated system allows us to analyze the way in which the courts are being used and be in a much better position to plan for the future of the Club to ensure its viability and success.

Ombersley School

Mike and his team continue to work with the children by providing after school clubs and holiday camps through school holidays.

We are looking forward to progress being made towards moving the existing school playground across to the other side of the school building thereby freeing up land for the creation of a larger school carpark. I think we will all breathe a sigh of relief when this happens. The school are hoping that they will be able to move the playground in Spring next year after the field has been prepared for use over Winter.

When the school has completed the work, the Club will then be in a position to develop the land to create 2 new courts, for which we already have planning permission.

Carpark

There are still incidents where parents/staff park their cars too close to the club gate making it difficult for members to pass safely on the slip road and we are regularly in contact with the school about this issue. The committee are constantly monitoring the situation and will continue to work with the school to ensure that a safe system is in place as time goes on.

In the meantime, we thank you for your continued patience in timing your arrival at the club outside the school pick-up and drop-off times to help alleviate the situation.

We were pleased to install a defibrillator at the Club and over 12 members have already had training on how to use this. **The code for the defibrillator is C159X.** Please make a note of this in case of an emergency.

In the interest of security, we are unable to display the code next to the defibrillator, but members can find this on the noticeboard inside the clubhouse.

The defibrillator is registered on 'The Circuit' which is a nationwide network, which passes on the location of the nearest defibrillator to those in need in the case of an emergency.

COACHING REPORT

Tennis & multi sports holiday camps

After the success of the 2021 holiday camps, we were keen to keep realistic expectations for 2022's camps. We were really pleased to see a very similar level of interest and attendance across all of the holidays and half terms in 2022 when comparing to the previous year.

The Multi sports element of the camps means that children who don't play tennis are able to come and have an introduction to our club and to try tennis in an informal, no pressure setting. Whilst the children who can play the game get to do so, as well as having a variety of other sports to develop their all round skills.

Off the back of running the holiday camps this year, we've been able to encourage more players who previously hadn't played tennis, to come down to our weekly sessions and try the sport in a more structured way.

Junior Programme

Building from last years programme of 40 players attending weekly coaching sessions, we have been able to encourage 20 more children to take up the sport at the club & now have around 60 players attending weekly coaching.

We are pleased to say that not only have the numbers gone up, but the overall standard of tennis being played has gone up as well, with lots of children developing skills to play the game.

As the players skill level and confidence has gone up we've been able to enter more teams than last year, with a total of 5 teams being entered into the LTA national winter junior leagues, ageing from 6 – 11 years.

Whilst maintaining strong links with Ombersley first school, we've also been able to provide a regular after school club for differing ages as well as some P.E. Lessons over at the club to support the children with their general physical development and adding our own specialist tennis insights.

We're keen to mention that as many as 5 junior players have now been selected to attend regular county training sessions at varying ages from 7-13 years old.

From the junior perspective the club is in a great place moving forward, we look forward to seeing how all of the players progress over the coming months and years at the club.

Adult Programme

The adult programme at the club is doing as well as ever, with Cardio tennis remaining a big hit with 3 sessions running weekly, with the highest numbers to boot. We're fortunate to now be able to offer a session for everyone at the club, from a beginner/intermediate level session in rusty rackets to a more advanced session with the mixed club coaching on a Tuesday and now a ladies and a men's team training running on a weekly basis for our team players.

We'll see around 50 players per week across all these sessions which is up from last year, showing how active a club we are becoming.

Working in tandem with the social sessions on and off court that the club arrange, we are a club that has a lot to offer for any prospective member.

Notable mentions

Theo Houston, aged 13, competed in a number of singles and doubles events over the summer, having his best success at the county closed event in the U16 mixed doubles, making the finals of the event with his partner. Combined with recently making it into the 18U county development squad, Theo has had a great year.

Jacob Vincent, Gethin Gould and Ben Perkins, all aged 9, had their LTA graded tournament debuts this year, with Ben managing to make his way to the final of a recent 10U grade 5 event as well as making it into the 10U county training squad. All of the boys are showing great promise & continue to commit themselves to a sport that they love! Jamie Cartwright, age 7 & Elouise Gibbs, aged 8 were invited and attended the 8U county training sessions this year after being selected at the county open day in Malvern earlier in the year.

From the adults programme a mention must go to Jen Preedy, Teri Baron & Paul Barley. Each one of them have, in a relatively short space of time, gone from the 'Rusty rackets' group, to being a regular team player – a credit to their hard work and persistence!
