AGM Reports 2022

Welcome to our 45th AGM

Reports on the state of the club's Finance, Membership and Court Maintenance position have been prepared by David (Finance), Andy (Membership) and Edwin (Maintenance) respectively. Belinda will cover coaching. I am therefore going to limit my comments to the committee's discussions and progress on facility development and proposed fees for the 2023-24 season. Before doing so however, I would like to thank all of our coaches (ably led by Belinda), the committee members and everyone who has volunteered at the club over the last year, particularly those who have organised social tennis. We would not have the facilities, community and membership we have today without them!

### **Court developments**

Over the last 4 years we have renovated the artificial grass and installed floodlights, on courts 1-3. The next stage of the development will be to replace the artificial courts when their useful life ends - which is expected within the next 2 years. The Committee have discussed the matter extensively and concluded that our favoured option is to install artificial clay courts as these meets our key criteria of being suitable for both coaching and social play. We hope that instillation will take place in early 2023 in time for the 2023-4 season.

In addition to replacing the surface on courts 1-3 we have been exploring the possibility of erecting Padle Courts behind Courts 4-6. Padle Tennis is the fastest-growing sport in the world - it's a fast-paced, social sport that's easy to pick up, but difficult to put down. It can be played by anyone and everyone, no matter your age or ability. Discussions are at an early stage but we have in principle agreement with the Community Trust and we are now looking at the funding and development practicalities.

## **Club House**

Members may be aware that the Community Trust is proposing to develop the centre reflecting increased demand. Part of the proposals would involve relocating our club house from the Conservatory to another part of the building, or even a separate club house. I have met with the Community Trust Chair, Deputy Chair and Manager to discuss the proposed development as have the Committee. We will keep members informed of the proposed development as and when it occurs but would not expect any immediate changes for a couple

of years as planning permission has not yet been sought and funding has to be found.

# Fees

Reflecting the club's financial position and the continuing need to build up funds to meet anticipated expenditure in the coming years (specifically the resurfacing of courts 1-3) and a sinking fund for courts 4-6 the Committee is proposing the following fees for the 2023-4, season payable from 1st April.

Adult full £160 Adult Weekday £100 Junior - under 10 £35 - 10-18 £55 Chaperone £40 Winter £80

Fees for packages eg 'adults and children' will be based on the above with discounts for "bulk" as in previous years.

Having looked at the fees charged by York Tennis Club, who have broadly comparable facilities, the proposed fees remain competitive.

Floodlight fees have been set at a level that covers the costs, currently £6 per hour

## Finally

I would like to say a special thank you to Mel Batey who is stepping down as Club secretary, Edwin Knighton who steps down as Vice Chair in the New Year and Sally Bell-Syer who represents the Club so well at the Community Trust meetings. Willing volunteers to take their place would be greatly appreciated. It is only possible to have such a vibrant club because of our volunteers.

#### John Lister, Chair

As last year, the maintenance team has been: Brian Graystone, Edwin Knighton and Pete Moss.We are very grateful for Gary Mundy's advice and help with carrying out electrical repairs.

Routine maintenance tasks have included:

- Removing debris, blowing courts
- Tractor brushing of courts 1-3
- Weeding the court gravel perimeter areas
- Trimming hedges and shrubs
- Moss removal to all courts
- Removal of pigeon excrement to Court 3

• Liaising with Replay Maintenance Contractor for Courts 1-3, 4 x a year; their contract costs the club approximately £1600

• Liaising with contractor, Chris Watkinson for trimming conifer hedges, 1 x per year "Aquacourt" Deep Clean of Courts 4- 6

The Macadam courts had become slippery due to a build of debris and moss again this year. To address this safety concern Replay Maintenance were contracted to carry out a high pressure jetting and scrub using their "Aquacourt" process carried out over 2 days in October. The process cost approximately £2000 and appears to have been very effective.

#### **Equipment**

A new high powered battery powered leaf blower has recently been bought to help remove the autumn leaves, at a cost of approximately £800.

#### Forecast for 2023

We estimate that a sum of  $\pounds$ 3,000 – 4,000 will be needed for routine maintenance in 2023, excluding any electrical work to the floodlights.

We plan to buy a new hedge trimmer.

Our floodlights for Courts 4-6 were installed in 1999 and there is likely to be some maintenance and bulb replacement needed in the near future. The guarantee for the new floodlights to Courts 1-3 has now expired.

Membership report 22/23

The following information is taken from the Clubspark website on 13/11/22 and compared to the document Membership numbers and Fees for 2021-21(sic) which I attach to the email to the secretary.

A slight reduction in the number of total members against previous years, however, increases in fees and types of memberships purchased has offset this reduction and income remains steady as outlined by the treasurer. Total members down by 13 from 2020/21. Family packages remain on an upward trajectory, with 53 sold vs 35 and 40 from previous years.
