

Rochdale Tennis Club: Code of Conduct

We try to run the club on a friendly and informal basis; however, some basic rules need to be applied to ensure the club runs smoothly.

General

- Please leave the courts free of litter and take your rubbish home with you. Do not chew gum or smoke on the courts.
- Appropriate footwear must always be worn when entering the courts, these should have flat soles and no studs. We do not enforce any colour code for clothing but request that members do not play in jeans and that tops are worn at all times.
- At peak times doubles tennis must be played unless there are no other members waiting to use courts. Play must be limited to 45 minutes if people are waiting to use courts.
- It is the responsibility of a player to decide whether a court is fit to be played on. This especially applies during wet or wintry conditions. Do not use the courts if there are thunderstorms in the area.
- Members must adhere to any Government restrictions on tennis activity

Court Etiquette

- All games must end by 10pm and no floodlights should be switched on after 9.30 to ensure they turn off by 10pm. This is a matter of common courtesy to our neighbours.
- Please always close gates to the courts upon leaving, along with doors to the changing rooms and floodlight box.
- Please try to keep noise to a minimum on the courts, and when leaving the premises.
- If no-one is waiting to use the courts after you are ready to leave – please slacken the nets slightly to reduce the pressure on the posts. This is done by turning the handle on one of the posts 2 rotations anti clockwise. If you have time, please brush your court if you have been playing on the artificial grass surface. The brush is usually located at the side of Court 1.
- Please do not walk behind players whilst a game, a rally or coaching is in progress, this is to avoid distracting other members and most importantly to avoid any potential accidents on court.
- If you are trying to cross a court please wait until you are invited to and it is safe to do so.
- If a stray ball comes onto your court don't knock it back immediately, wait until the owners are ready and then hit it to the server's end.

Visitors to RTC

Visitors are welcome to play with a member at RTC as long as it has been pre-arranged and approved by a committee member by email. It is the responsibility of the RTC member to brief their guest regarding the RTC Code of Conduct. A £5 charge is payable for each visit which must be paid promptly by BACS using 'Visitor-visitor name' as reference for the transaction. A visitor may play up to three times in a year (1st April to 31st March), after that they will need to become a member of RTC. Should the visitor decide to join the club, their visitor's fees will be deducted from their membership fee. To arrange for a guest to visit, please contact one of the committee members below: -

Use of changing rooms and Cricket Club

- We are requested by the Cricket Club not to take tennis bags into the clubhouse. During and after matches team captains should ensure this is adhered to by both home and away teams and also that any food/rubbish is cleared up before leaving.
- Parents/Guardians are responsible for the supervision of their children when using the club changing rooms

All Club members should endeavour to protect and further the Club's good reputation at all times. When representing the Club, all players and officials will observe the principles in this Code of Conduct.

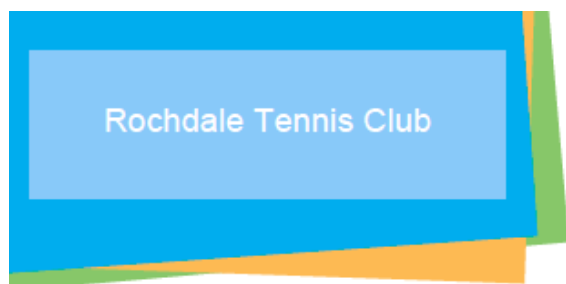
