#### **Defibrillator Locations**

With the chances of someone surviving a cardiac arrest increasing from 6% to 74% if a shock is delivered in the first 3-5 minutes, the power of a defibrillator should never be underestimated. There are two defibrillators located close by the tennis courts, one on the front (field) side of the Sports & Social Club, the other at the MUGA sports pitch located on the far side of the bowls club.

### **Hedge Cutting Team**

There is now a lot more light at this end, plus the reduction in height will only help prevent further root damage to the courts and simplify future maintenance efforts.
